

40. (Whiskey Slough, Weyl-Zuckerman Company.) The Executive Officer reported to the Commission that it did not appear that Weyl-Zuckerman and Company had any claim to certain reclaimed land in Whiskey Slough, but that this firm had indicated their desire to clear their claim to title by purchase of this land from the State. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the Executive Officer was instructed to negotiate with the Weyl-Zuckerman Company for the sale of the surface of this reclaimed land with the understanding that all minerals in the land shall be reserved to the State.

41. (Organization of Staff.) The Executive Officer reported to the Commission regarding possible rearrangement of clerical staff and the necessity for additional personnel. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the Commission authorized the establishment of an additional classification of Accountant-Auditor, Grade I, subject to the approval of such classification by the Personnel Board and directed that the Executive Officer bring the matter to the Personnel Board for consideration.

42. (Office Equipment.) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to purchase for the Los Angeles office, a Four Drawer Map File Case with Base and Top, at an expenditure not to exceed \$225.50.

43. (Application to Redrill "Speik" No. 4, Easement No. 300.) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to approve the redrilling of this well in the main zone at Huntington Beach subject to conformity with the rules and regulations and subject to a satisfactory upward adjustment of the royalty provision of the easement upon a basis of mutual consent.

44. A letter was read from the State Controller in which he stated that the sum of \$335,000.00 should be transferred from the State Lands Act Fund to the General Fund, State Beach Fund and State Park Fund in sums of 30%, 23 1/3% and 46 2/3%, respectively. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted approving this transfer.

45. Subject to later confirmation, upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted tentatively setting the next meeting on September 8th in Los Angeles and the succeeding meeting on October 6th in Sacramento.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
