

A meeting of the State Lands Commission was held in Room 301 State Building, Los Angeles, on December 1, 1947 at 3:30 P.M.

1. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the minutes of the meeting of the State Lands Commission held in Santa Barbara on October 29, 1947 were approved and confirmed as submitted.

2. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the matter of a date for the next meeting of the Commission was deferred for later determination of a specific date in January.

3. (Authorization for Redrill - Wilshire Oil Company - Easement 401, Huntington Beach) The Commission was informed that pursuant to resolution by them on October 29, 1947 the operators of wells in the Huntington Beach Tideland Field which might be affected by the redrilling of Wilshire Oil Company Well 401 - 15, were notified of the basis upon which the redrilling of the subject well would be permitted, and advised that any objection by them would be heard at this meeting.

In response to this notice, representatives had requested appearance on behalf of Roscoe F. Oakes, et al., the Simaroo Company and the Wilshire Oil Company.

After a full discussion by all interested parties, upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the redrilling of Huntington Beach 15 as qualifiedly approved on October 29, 1947, and deferring the approval for redrilling Simaroo Well 260-2 and Termo Well 409-4 until such redrilling is necessary and the conditions involved known.

4. (Request for Deferment of Drilling Requirements - Hamilton and Sherman, et al., Huntington Beach - Oil and Gas Lease No. P.R.C. 91) The Commission was informed that a request had been received from H. R. Hamilton, et al., Lessees under State Oil and Gas Lease No. P.R.C. 91, Huntington Beach, for an extension of the deferment of further drilling requirements under Oil and Gas Lease No. P.R.C. 91, as granted by the Commission on August 19, 1947 for the period ending November 17, 1947. The proposed deferment would be subject to the right of the State at any time to serve notice upon the Lessee to either resume development or quitclaim the undeveloped areas of the lease as provided for in the subject lease.

On June 28, 1947, the Commission approved the procedure of deferring any current drilling requirements under the terms of any State Oil and Gas Lease, upon the request of the lessee, until such time as the status in equity of such requirement has been clarified.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to grant a deferment of any further drilling requirements as stated in Oil and Gas Lease No. P.R.C. 91, as modified, for a period of ninety days from November 17, 1947. The grant of the deferment is to be subject to the right of the State at any time to serve notice upon the Lessee to either resume development under the lease or to quitclaim all undeveloped areas.

5. (Agreement for Easement No. 415 - Standard Oil Company of California - Rio Vista) The Commission was informed that the staff had reviewed Revision 25 (Pool Basis) to the State's allotment of lands under Agreement for Easement No. 415 as submitted for approval in accordance with said Agreement for Easement by the Standard Oil Company.

The suggested revision is tabulated below:

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to approve the 25th revision (Pool Basis) to Exhibit "A" of Agreement for Easement No. 415, Rio Vista, effective retroactive to 8:00 A.M., August 1, 1947.

6. (Stanislaus County - Application for Right of Way for Construction of Bridges over San Joaquin River - W.O. 172) The Commission was informed that an application had been received from the County Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County to occupy certain sovereign lands of the State for the construction of the Crow's Landing Bridge and the Grayson Bridge across the San Joaquin River. These two bridges are to cost in excess of \$200,000.00 and are to be incorporated into the County Road System as feeders to U. S. Highway 99 and State Highway 35.
