

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO 24 OF THE PRESENT LESSEES OF ARKSITES AT CORTE MADERA CREEK, (AS LISTED BELOW,) OR TO SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST TO SUCH LESSEES, NEW LEASES COVERING THE RESPECTIVE ARKSITES FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS, AT AN ANNUAL RENTAL OF \$50, PLUS \$15 FOR EACH STRUCTURE OR RESIDENCE THEREON, WITH RIGHT OF RENEWAL FOR AN ADDITIONAL FIVE YEARS AT SUCH TERMS AS MAY BE DETERMINED PRIOR TO RENEWAL; SUBJECT, HOWEVER, TO THE CONDITION THAT AS PART OF THE CONSIDERATION EACH LESSEE SHALL DEFRAY HIS OR HER PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF THE COST OF CONSTRUCTING A SEWER SERVING THE ARKSITES AND SHALL PROVIDE PROPER AND ADEQUATE CONNECTION TO SUCH SEWER FROM HIS OR HER ARK AT NO COST TO THE STATE, SUCH SEWER AND HOUSE CONNECTION TO BE FINANCED, CONSTRUCTED, AND INSTALLED IN SUCH MANNER AS THE STATE MAY DETERMINE: 10

25. (RELINQUISHMENT OF 42,000 ACRES, APPLICATION 034260 - W.O. 564.) On February 18, 1942, pursuant to the request of the War Department, the State made application for an exchange of lands under Paragraph 8(o) of the Taylor Grazing Act, as amended. The application proposed that some 42,000 acres of State lands within the boundaries of military reservations be exchanged for public lands of approximately the same area, lying in Shasta and Trinity Counties. At the time the application was made, the lands selected by the State were unappropriated, unreserved and unwithdrawn and, with a few minor exceptions on account of mineral entries, were subject to selection by the State. The selected lands were duly inspected by the Regional Field Examiner, and reports thereon were made to the General Land Office in Washington, D. C. After an exchange of several telegrams during the year 1947, the then Acting Secretary of the Interior Chapman wired this office as follows:

"Re tel September 25, State Exchange Application Sacramento 034260. I am informed by the Bureau of Land Management that the case is now under adjudication looking toward the authorization of publication. Action on the application can be expected in the near future."

No further information was received concerning the State's application until January 26, 1948, when this office received a letter from the Director of the Bureau of Land Management, rejecting in part the State's application. The rejected area amounted to approximately 16,000 acres, which on November 6, 1947, were placed under First Form Reclamation Withdrawal for use in connection with the Central Valley Reclamation Project.

The State appealed from said rejection, but the appeal was denied and the rejection became final. Thereupon, the State withdrew certain State lands in Lassen County embraced within the military reservation known as the Sierra Ordnance Depot. Subsequent thereto, the State entered into a lease with the War Department for said 16,000 acres of State lands offered as a portion of the base in said exchange application. No further action has been taken by the Bureau of Land Management as to the remaining 26,000 acres embraced in the State's exchange application, and on August 29, 1951, a lease was entered into between the State and the War Department covering 21,120 acres of State school lands in a military reservation in the vicinity of Barstow, California, known as the Camp Irwin area. The 21,120 acres were a part of the school lands offered in Exchange Application 034260 made on February 15, 1942.

The remaining 6,000 acres of State lands offered as base in said application were school sections in Lassen County within the military withdrawal known as Honey Lake Bombing Area. However, the area of said military withdrawal was reduced, and the 6,000 acres of State school lands therein were eliminated and therefore became invalid base.

26. (RENEWAL OF LEASES, FISH CANYON, LOS ANGELES COUNTY - W.O.'s 1180, 1183, 1185, AND 1189.) Several of the present leases covering lots in Fish Canyon, Section 16, T. 1 N., R. 10 W., S.B.M., Los Angeles County, expire on December 31, 1951. Due to the proposed exchange of Section 16 for Forest Service land in Tulare County, it is considered inadvisable to issue new leases for more than one year.
