

Extension of the permit from September 22, 1952, is requested because the required concurrent permit from the State Fish and Game Commission cannot be secured prior to that time.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE AN EXTENSION OF GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMIT P.R.C. 717 TO THE HUMBLE OIL AND REFINING CO. FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION OPERATIONS ON THOSE TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION LYING SOUTHERLY OF THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY OF VENTURA COUNTY, AS EXTENDED, AND NORTHERLY OF THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY OF THE CITY OF OCEANSIDE, COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO, AS EXTENDED, FOR A PERIOD OF 90 DAYS FROM AND AFTER SEPTEMBER 22, 1952, THE PERMITTEE TO REIMBURSE THE DIVISION OF STATE LANDS FOR ALL OF ITS INSPECTION COSTS. THE PERMIT IS TO BE EFFECTIVE ONLY WHEN A CONCURRENT PERMIT FOR THE SAME OPERATING AREA IS AUTHORIZED BY THE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION.

37. (SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION, HUMBLE OIL & REFINING CO., SANTA BARBARA COUNTY - P.R.C. 724.1, W.O. 1254.) An application has been received from the Humble Oil and Refining Co. requesting a 90-day extension from and after September 22, 1952, of the term of Submarine Geophysical Exploration Permit P.R.C. 724.1. Permit P.R.C. 724.1 was authorized on May 26, 1952 (Minute Item 17, Page 1558), covering submarine geophysical exploration operations on those tide and submerged lands under the jurisdiction of the Commission lying southerly and easterly of the easterly boundary of the City of Santa Barbara, as extended, and northerly and westerly of the easterly boundary of the County of Santa Barbara, as extended, for the period May 23, 1952, to August 23, 1952, inclusive.

A statement of objection to the issuance of the original permit was filed by the County of Santa Barbara, but no interest was expressed by the County of Santa Barbara in the extension on June 30, 1952, of the term of Permit 718 covering submarine geophysical exploration operations westerly from the westerly city limits of the City of Santa Barbara to Point Estero, San Luis Obispo County. No complaints or objections have been received relative to operations conducted under current permits effective for areas offshore from Santa Barbara County.

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
