

28. (APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF LOCATION OF TELEPHONE FACILITIES, AND RIGHT-OF-WAY, SCHOOL LANDS, LASSEN COUNTY, CITIZENS UTILITIES COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA - W.O. 1919, P.R.C. 1436.9.) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"The Citizens Utilities Company of California has applied for the approval of the location of existing telephone facilities across school lands in the Sierra Ordnance Depot, Lassen County, and the concurrent use of the lands crossed as a right-of-way to telephone facilities to be constructed on contiguous lands. The parcel to be crossed is 60 feet in width and 40 feet in length. The Attorney General's Office, in an informal opinion, has advised that telephone companies may install facilities across school lands without being required to pay rental; however, the State may require removal, when and if it is determined that the existence of said facilities will adversely affect the sale price of the school lands crossed, and the State may require the telephone company to locate or relocate said facilities to protect the primary purpose of the lands crossed. Filing fee and expense deposit have been paid."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CITIZENS UTILITIES COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA, IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM PREVIOUSLY APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION FOR AGREEMENTS WITH PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY, EXCEPT THAT IT SHALL CONTAIN TWO ADDITIONAL PARAGRAPHS RELATING TO REMOVAL AND RELOCATION OF FACILITIES, COVERING THE AERIAL TELEPHONE FACILITIES IN EXISTENCE, WITH NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO, AND A RIGHT-OF-WAY OVER THE SURFACE CROSSED 60 FEET IN WIDTH BY 40 FEET IN LENGTH, TO PROPOSED TELEPHONE FACILITIES ON CONTIGUOUS LANDS IN SIERRA ORDNANCE DEPOT, LASSEN COUNTY.

29. (APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS, SANTA BARBARA, VENTURA, LOS ANGELES, ORANGE AND SAN DIEGO COUNTIES, WESTERN GULF OIL COMPANY - W.O. 1916, P.R.C. 1445.1.) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"The Western Gulf Oil Company has made application for extension of the term of Submarine Geophysical Exploration Permits P.R.C. 1445.1(A), 1445.1(B) and 1445.1(C), authorized for operation off-shore in the area between Santa Barbara and San Diego Counties, to permit completion of the exploration program which is in progress currently. Permits P.R.C. 1445.1(A), (B) and (C) were issued October 7, 1954 for the period October 7, 1954 to December 31, 1954, inclusive. The time extension requested is for 90 days from January 1, 1955. The Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Santa Barbara, Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego and the City Council and Mayor of the City of Santa Barbara have been informed that this application is to be considered."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE EXTENSIONS OF SUBMARINE GEO-PHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS P.R.C. 1445.1(A), (B) AND (C) IN CONFORMANCE WITH ALL OPERATING CONDITIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION, TO THE WESTERN GULF OIL COMPANY FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL OPERATIONS ON THOSE TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION IN THE AREA OFFSHORE BETWEEN A LINE DRAWN DUE SOUTH FROM POINT CONCEPTION, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, AND THE WESTERLY PROLONGATION OF THE CALIFORNIA-MEXICO BORDER, FOR THE PERIOD TERMINATING MARCH 31, 1955, INCLUSIVE. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE EXPLORATION PERMITS ARE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED, AND THE EXTENSION IS TO BE EFFECTIVE ONLY AS LONG AS CONCURRENT PERMITS BY THE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE SAME OPERATING AREA.

30. (APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS, VENTURA, LOS ANGELES, ORANGE AND SAN DIEGO COUNTIES, RICHFIELD OIL CORPORATION - P.R.C. 1433.1(A) AND P.R.C. 1433.1(B).) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"The Richfield Oil Corporation has made application for the extension of the term of Submarine Geophysical Permits P.R.C. 1433.1(A) and P.R.C. 1433.1(B), authorized for operation in the offshore areas lying between the northerly boundary of the County of Ventura and the California-Mexico border, to permit completion of the exploration program for which these permits were originally requested. The subject permits were authorized by the Commission on August 25, 1954, for the period October 1, 1954 to December 31, 1954 (Minute Item 4, page 2144). The time extension requested currently is for the period terminating March 31, 1955. The Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego have been informed that this application is to be considered."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE EXTENSIONS OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS P.R.C. 1433.1(A), (B), CONFORMING TO ALL OPERATING CONDITIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION, TO THE RICHFIELD OIL CORPORATION, FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION OPERATIONS ON THOSE TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION LYING OFFSHORE BETWEEN THE PROLONGATION SEAWARD OF THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY OF THE COUNTY OF VENTURA, AND THE PROLONGATION SEAWARD OF THE CALIFORNIA-MEXICO BORDER, FOR THE PERIOD TERMINATING MARCH 31, 1955. THE PERMITTEE IS TO REIMBURSE THE DIVISION OF STATE LANDS FOR ALL OF ITS INSPECTION COSTS. THE PERMIT IS TO BE EFFECTIVE ONLY AS LONG AS A CONCURRENT PERMIT BY THE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION IS IN EFFECT FOR THE SAME OPERATING AREA.

31. (APPROVAL OF SURVEY OF THE MEAN HIGH TIDE LINE ON THE SHORE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN, VICINITY OF CARDIFF, SAN DIEGO COUNTY - W.O. 1927, GEO.-SAN DIEGO COUNTY.) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"This survey was made for the Division of Beaches and Parks under the supervision of the engineering staff of the State Lands Commission.
