"The determination of the O.H.W.M. was essential to establish the line of State ownership in connection with the acquisition of property for a proposed State beach."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

32. (APPROVAL OF ORDINARY HIGH WATER MARK SURVEY ON THE SHORE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN - W.O. 1667, GEO.-VENTURA COUNTY.) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"This survey, under W.O. 1667, consisted of two sections. One was in the vicinity of Funta, Ventura County, California, extending approximately one mile along the shore line. The second section of shore line extended from the Rincon Oil Field, vicinity of Seacliff, southeasterly for approximately three-quarter miles. The purpose of this survey was to tie into existing O.H.W.M. surveys and thus complete the O.H.W.M. for the portion of the Ventura County shore line between the northerly Ventura County line and the Ventura River. The completion of this work order also makes it possible to initiate a subsidence investigation to determine if settlement is occurring in the vicinity of the Rincon Oil Field."

33. (APPROVAL OF SURVEY OF THE ORDINARY HIGH WATER MARK ON THE SHORE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN, VICINITY OF OXNARD, VENTURA COUNTY - W.O. 1615, GEO.-VENTURA COUNTY.) The Commission's staff reported as follows:

"The purpose of this survey was to tie into a previous O.H.W.M. survey in this area to permit accurate location of oil company leases."
