"The Assessor of Kern County has assessed contiguous land from \$1.50 to \$5.75 per acre, thus indicating its appraised value to be from \$3 to \$11.50 per acre.

"An inspection and appraisal by a member of the Commission's staff on February 20, 1955, establishes the value of the subject land at \$10 per acre. The California Portland Cement Company posted the necessary amount to meet this value. Said appraisal also indicates that the land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation.

"The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that the selection thereof will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition place said land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

"The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, subject to future approval and listing. There has been no objection to this acquisition by the State."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND COMPRISED IN THE SEL OF NOL AND BLOF SWE OF SECTION 26, T. 11 N., R. 14 W., S.B.M., CONTAINING 120 ACRES IN KERN COUNTY; THE COMMIS-SION FINDS THAT SAID FEDERAL LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION; THE COM-MISSION SELECTS AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF SAID LAND, FOR CASH, TO THE CALL-FORNIA PORTLAND CEMENT COMPANY AT THE APPRAISED CASH PRICE OF \$1,200, SUBJECT TO ALL STATUTORY RESERVATIONS INCLUDING MINERALS, UPON THE LISTING (CONVEYANCE) OF SAID LAND TO THE STATE BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

13. (SALE OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, OBTAINED THROUGH USE OF BASE, SCRIP APPLI-CATION NO. 4982, SACRAMENTC LAND DISTRICT, MARIPOSA COUNTY, STATE OF CALIFOR-NIA, DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, DIVISION OF FORESTRY - S.W.O. 5723.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An offer has been received from the State of California, Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry, to purchase Lots 1 and 2 of Section 1, T. 5 S., R. 17 E., and Lot 4 of Section 6, T. 5 S., R. 18 E., M.D.M., containing 68.92 acres in Mariposa County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government through use of base.

"The Assessor of Mariposa County has assessed contiguous land at \$3 per acre, thus indicating its appraised value to be \$6 per acre.

"An inspection and appraisal by a member of the Commission's staff on February 17, 1955, establishes the value of the subject land at \$8 per acro. Said appraisal also indicates that the land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation. "The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that the selection thereof will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant.

"The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, subject to future approval and listing."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND COMPRISED IN LOTS 1 AND 2 OF SECTION 1, T. 5 S., R. 17 E., AND LOT 4 OF SECTION 6, T. 5 S., R. 18 E., M.D.M., CONTAINING 68.92 ACRES IN MARIPOSA COUNTY; THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT SAID FEDERAL LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION; THE COMMISSION SELECTS AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF SAID LAND, FOR CASH, TO THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, DIVI-SION OF FORESTRY, AT THE APPRAISED CASH PRICE OF \$551.36 FLUS \$74 EXPENSE FRES, CA & TOTAL OF \$625.36, SUBJECT TO ALL STATUTORY RESERVATIONS INCLUDING MINERALS, UPON THAT LISTING (CONVEYANCE) OF SAID LAND TO THE STATE BY THE FEDERAL GOVERN-HENT.

14. (APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF SUBMARINE (BEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS, SANTA BARBARA TO SAN DIEGO COUNTIES, UNION OF CALIFORNIA - P.R.C. 1468.1) The following report was presented to the Countission:

"The Union Oil Company of California has made application for extension of the term of Submarine Geophysical Exploration Permits P.R.C. 1468.1, authorized for operation offshore in the area between Sants Barbars County and the California-Maxico border, to permit completion of the exploration program which is in progress currently. Permits P.R.C. 1468.1 were issued for the period January 1, 1955 to March 31, 1955, inclusive. The time extension requested is for the period April 1, 1955 to June 30, 1955, inclusive. The Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Santa Barbara, Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego, and the City Council and Mayor of the City of Santa Barbara have been informed that this extension is to be considered."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE AN EXTENSION OF SUBMARINE GEO-PHYSICAL EXPLORATION PERMITS P.R.C. 1468.1, IN CONFORMANCE WITH ALL OPERAT-ING CONDITIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION, TO THE UNION OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUBMARINE GEOPHYSICAL EXPLORATION OPERATIONS ON THOSE TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION LYING OFFSHORE BETWEEN THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY OF SANTA BARBARA COUNTY AND THE CALIFORNIA-MEXICO BORDER, FOR THE PERIOD APRIL 1, 1955 TO JUNE 30, 1955, INCLUSIVE. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE EXPLORATION PERMITS ARE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED, AND THE EXTENSION IS TO BE EFFECTIVE ONLY AS LONG AS A CONCURRENT PERMIT BY THE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION IS IN EFFECT FOR THE SAME OPERATING AREA.
