

22. (GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT, SANTA BARBARA, VENTURA AND LOS ANGELES COUNTIES, STANDARD OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA - W. O. 2300, P.R.C. 1716.1.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An application has been received from Standard Oil Company of California for permission to conduct geological exploration from mobile marine equipment during the period May 1, 1956 through October 31, 1956. Permission has been requested to conduct core drilling operations below a depth of 500 feet beneath the ocean floor in those tide and submerged lands under the jurisdiction of the Commission in the offshore area between a line drawn due West from Pt. Arguello, Santa Barbara County, and the prolongation seaward of the westerly boundary line of the City of Los Angeles effective for the legislative grant of tide and submerged lands to the City of Los Angeles under Chapter 656, Statutes of 1911. The statutory application filing fee has been paid by the applicant."
