On May 18, 1956 (Minute Item 18, pages 2686-88) the Commission authorized deferment of action in connection with the offering of a lease of 7,200 acres of tide and submerged lands in Orange County, under W. O. 2242, until such time as the office of the Attorney General and the staff of the State Lands Commission have had an opportunity to explore further the problems involved.

On December 4, 1956 the County of Orange filed a complaint for declaratory relief (70717 Superior Court, Orange County) requesting the court to determine and declare the territorial extent of legislative grants of tide and submerged lands to Orange County. In connection with these problems, the office of the Attorney General has recommended that legislation be introduced for the purpose of defining the legislative intent in the grant of tide and submerged lands to the County of Orange by Chapter 526, Statutes of 1919. Such legislation has been introduced by Senator Cunningham in Senate Bill 1796 at the suggestion of the staff.
