

MINUTE ITEM

29. (SELECTION OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, LIEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 10725, LOS ANGELES LAND DISTRICT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, WILLARD ABNER - S.W.O. 5909.)

After consideration of Calendar Item 8 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND EMERACED IN THE NW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF NW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SECTION 22, T. 6 N., R. 1 W., S.B.M., CONTAINING 40 ACRES IN SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY; THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT SAID LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION WITHOUT ARTIFICIAL IRRIGATION; THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE SELECTION OF SAID LAND AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE THEREOF PURSUANT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SALE OF VACANT STATE SCHOOL LAND. FURTHER, THE COMMISSION CONFIRMS THE TWO 20-DAY EXTENSION PERIODS AND ONE 10-DAY EXTENSION PERIOD GRANTED TO THE APPLICANT, WILLARD ABNER, WITHIN WHICH TO DEPOSIT ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO MEET THE APPRAISED VALUE.

SALE OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND

(SELECTION OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, LEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 10725, LOS ANGELES LAND DISTRICT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, WILLARD ABNER - S.W.O. 5909.)

An offer has been received from Willard Abner of Maywood, California, to purchase the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, T. 6 N., R. 1 W., S.B.M., containing 40 acres in San Bernardino County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government under the indemnity selection procedure. The applicant made an offer of \$200, or \$5 per acre.

An appraisal report completed by a member of the Commission's staff under date of October 6, 1958, establishes the value of the subject land at \$100 per acre, for a total value of \$4,000. The application was cancelled as the applicant did not meet the appraised value within the 20 days allowed by the Rules and Regulations of the State Lands Commission, nor during the two 20 day-extension periods and one 10-day extension period, which were granted at the request of the applicant to allow time for the deposit of additional funds. The appraisal also indicates that the land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation.

The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that it will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and, in addition will, after sale, place the land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management and the land was listed (conveyed) to the State on May 20, 1958.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION DETERMINE THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND EMBRACED IN THE NW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF NW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SECTION 22, T. 6 N., R. 1 W., S.B.M., CONTAINING 40 ACRES IN SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY; THAT THE COMMISSION FIND THAT SAID LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION WITHOUT ARTIFICIAL IRRIGATION; THAT THE COMMISSION APPROVE THE SELECTION OF SAID LAND AND AUTHORIZE THE SALE THEREOF PURSUANT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SALE OF VACANT STATE SCHOOL LAND. IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION CONFIRM THE TWO 20-DAY EXTENSION PERIODS AND ONE 10-DAY EXTENSION PERIOD GRANTED TO THE APPLICANT, WILLARD ABNER, WITHIN WHICH TO DEPOSIT ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO MEET THE APPRAISED VALUE.
