On April 5, 1960, two bids were received in response to a published notice of intention of the State Lands Commission to enter into a lease for the extraction of minerals from approximately 40 acres of vacant State school land in the $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}$, the $S_{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $SW_{\frac{1}{$

Publication of this offer was authorized by the Commission on January 21, 1960 (Minute Item 16, page 5585). The high bidder, Russell A. Donnelly, failed to submit a financial statement establishing conclusively his financial ability to undertake and fulfill all obligations under the prospective lease. The second bid, submitted by Cena M. Austin, et al., for Ruth Mines was a conditional bid that deviated from the term of the proposal to lease. The office of the Attorney General has advised that both bids submitted are such that they may be rejected by the Commission.
