JULY 7, 1962, THROUGH JULY 6, 1963. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF  
THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED AND IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF PROSPECTING PERMIT P.R.C. 2565.2, RIVERSIDE COUNTY;  
AL ROBERT BROOKS - W.O. 4428.

Prospecting Permit P.R.C. 2565.2, covering approximately 160 acres of State land in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 16, T. 2 S., R. 5 E., S.B.B. & M., Riverside County, was issued July 7, 1960, to Mr. Al Robert Brooks, surface owner, authorizing prospecting for all minerals other than oil and gas.

Prospecting Permit P.R.C. 2565.2 provides in part, in conformance with Division 6 of the Public Resources Code, that "...in no event shall the term of this permit exceed two years from date hereof except as the Commission may, in its discretion, extend the term of this permit an additional period not exceeding one year."

A field reconnaissance disclosed that exploratory work, at the reported cost of \$20,000, conducted on the adjoining permit area held by Al Robert Brooks in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 16, under Prospecting Permit P.R.C. 2564.2, has developed a commercial body of dolomite ore of approximately 50,000 tons. Total shipments of 95 tons of this ore have been made from the deposit. The ore body strikes in an east-west direction, and appears to extend at depth into the area included in Prospecting Permit P.R.C. 2565.2. As a result of the exploration work and the development of a commercial ore deposit on the adjoining permit area which may continue into subject permit area, an extension of time will be necessary to further explore the extent of the ore body and the commercial potential of the area included in Prospecting Permit P.R.C. 2565.2. With the exception of work requirements, all other terms and conditions of the permit have been complied with by the permittee.

The permittee has requested a one-year extension of the permit term through July 6, 1963.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO GRANT A ONE-YEAR EXTENSION OF THE TERM OF PROSPECTING PERMIT P.R.C. 2565.2, HELD BY AL ROBERT BROOKS, FROM JULY 7, 1962, THROUGH JULY 6, 1963. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED AND IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.
