36. APPROVAL OF MAPS OF THE ORDINARY HIGH WATER MARK ALONG THE SHORE OF THE GULF OF SANTA CATALINA, VICINITY OF OCEANSIDE, SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA - W.O. 4411, GEO.-SAN DIEGO CO.

APPROVAL OF MAPS OF THE ORDINARY HIGH WATER MARK ALONG THE SHORE OF THE GULF OF SANTA CATALINA, VICINITY OF OCEANSIDE, SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA - W.O. 4411.

Artificial conditions were introduced along the ocean in the vicinity of Camp Pendleton by the construction of the Del Mar Boat Basin in 1942. The extent of this artificial influence is uncertain, but the combined effect of the Del Mar Boat Basin breakwaters and recent jetty construction in the vicinity of the San Luis Rey River by the City of Oceanside will extend artificial conditions at least as far as Wisconsin Avenue in Oceanside.

A Survey of Record of the Mean High Tide Line, made in 1939 by McKissick & Bell has been reviewed by the staff and has been found to be acceptable as the last known survey of the mean high tide line prior to the construction of the Del Mar Boat Basin. This Record of Survey is delineated as the Ordinary High Water Mark of 1939 from the North City Limits of Oceanside to the westerly boundary of the Rancho Santa Margarita Y Las Flores.

The Ordinary High Water Mark from the Rancho Santa Margarita Boundary to Wisconsin Avenue was determined by a study and comparison of aerial photographs of 1938 and 1960. The aerial photographs show that the tide lines in 1938 and in 1960 coincide when they reach Wisconsin Avenue.

The City of Oceanside is presently leasing State tidelands in the vicinity of the San Luis Rey River waterward of the Ordinary High Water Mark of 1939, as shown on subject maps.
