3. APPLICATION FOR LIFE-OF-STRUCTURE PERMIY OVER STATE SOVEREIGN LANDS OF AMERICAN RIVER AT CITY OF SACRAMENTO, SACRAMENTO COUNTY; SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL UMILTTY DISIRICT - W.0. 4702, P.R.C. 3000.9 .

After consideration of Calendar Item 12 a.ttached, and upon motion duly male and unanimously cerried, the following resolution was adopted:

PURSUATP TIO IHE PROVISIONS OF PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE SECTION 12808, THE EXECUIIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO SACRAMENIO MUNICIPAL UTITITY DISIRICT A LIFE-OF-SIRUCIURE PERMIT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, AND USE OF A POWIR LINE OVER THE FOLIOWING-DESCRIBED LAMDS:

beginning at a poinl on the nean lon waiter line along the southeriy BARK OF THE AMERIGAF RIVAR, SAID POINI BEITG THE NORIHEASTERLY CORNER OF THAT CERTATN "RECORD OF SURVEY OF A PORTION OF SECTION 12, T. 8 N., R. 5 E., AND SHCTION 7, T. 8 N., R. 6 E., M.D.B.\& M.", RECORDH IN MHE OFFICE JF THE RECORDER OF SAGEAVETHU COUNTY ON Decenber 15, 1960, in bock 17 OF sunveys at pace 12; Thence, From SAID POINT OF BECIMITM TORTH $12^{\circ} 27^{\prime} 56^{\prime \prime}$ WEST HOI. 7 FEET TO A POINT ON THE MEAN LOY WATER LINE ALONG MHE HORTHERLY BARK OF THE AMERICANS EIVER.

APPLICATION FOR LIFT-OF-SERIUMURE PERMIT OVER STATE SOVEREIGN LANDS OF AMERICAN RIVER AT CITYY OF SACRAMENTO, SACRAMENYO COUNIY; SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL UIILITY DISTRICT - W.O. 4702 .

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District has applied for a life-of-structure permit covering 0.092 acre nore or less of state sovereign lands of the cacramento River at the City of Sacramento (see Exhibit "A"). This permit is for a new 12 KV power line which will tie together two existing power lines to provide better service for the easterly section of greater Sacramento,

The Public Utilities Code Section 12808 provides $\varepsilon$ हS Sollows:
"A district may construct works across or along any street or public highray, or over any of the lemds which are the property of the State, and it shall have the same rights and privileges appertaining thereto as are granted to municipalities within the state. The district shall restore any such street or highway to its enrmer state as near as may be, and in compliance with local ordinances, and shall not use it in a manner to unnecessarily impair its usefulness. A district may also construct its works across any stream or watercourse."

IT IS RECOMMENDED TEAT, PURSUANT TO THE FROUTSIONS OF FUBLIC UIILITIES CODE SECTION 12808, THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL URIEITY DISTRICT A LIFE-UF-STRUCHURE PERMIT FF THE CONETRUCTION, MAINTEIANCE, AND USE OF A FOKER IINE OVAR THE FOLLOWING- LISCRIBED IANDS:

beginving at a poinl on the mean low water line along tie southerly BANK OF THE AMERICAN RIVER, SAID POINT BEING THE NORTHEASTERLY CORNET OF THAT CERTATN "RECORD OF SURVEY OF A PORTION OF SECTION 12, T. 8 N., R. 5 E., AND SECTION 7, T. 8 N., R. 6 E., M.D.B. $\&$ M.", RECORDED IN THE OFFICE OF THE RECORDER OF SACRAMBNIO COUNTY ON dECEMBER 15, 1960, IN BOOK 17 OF SURVEYS AT PAGP 12; THENCE, FROM SAID POINE OF BEGINNING NORTH $12^{\circ} 27^{\prime} 56^{\prime \prime}$ west 401.7 Febis to a foint on the mean low watier line along the northerly bank OF THE AMERICAN RIVER.
