16. APPLICATION FOR SUBMARINE FLOW-LINE EASEMENT FOR OCEAN-FLOOR OIL-WELL COMPLETION, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY; PHILLIPS PETROLEUM COMPANY - W.O. 4906, P.R.C. 3069.1.

After consideration of Calendar Item 23 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO PHILLIPS PETROLEUM COMPANY A 49-YEAR EASE ENT, AT AN ANNUAL PENTAL OF \$160.10 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF SUBMARINE FLOW LINES OVER TIDE AND SUBMERGED IAT LANDS OF THE SANTA BARBARA CHANNEL, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE MEAN HIGH TIDE LINE ON THE SHORE OF SANTA BARBARA CHANNEL WHICH BEARS N. 61° 12' 59" W., 106.37 FEET FROM STATION 182 ON SAID LINE AS SHOWN UPON THE MAP ENTITLED "SURVEY OF THE MEAN HIGH TIDE LINE ALONG THE SHORE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN, VICINITY OF TAJIGUAS CREEK", DATED FEBRUARY, 1957, SHEET 12 OF 39, AND RECORDED IN BOOK 41 OF MISCELLANEOUS MAPS AT PAGE 23, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY RECORDS; THENCE FROM SAID POINT OF BEGINNING S. 42° 06' 09" W., 4,909.73 FEET TO THE EASTERN LINE OF STATE LEASE P.R.C. 2933.1, CONTAINING 5.636 ACRES MORE OR LESS.

APPLICATION FOR SUBMARINE FLOW-LINE EASEMENT FOR OCEAN-FLOOR OIL-WELL COMPLETION, SANTA BARBAR' COUNTY; PHILLIPS PETROLEUM COMPANY - W.O. 4906.

An application has been received from Phillips Petroleum Company for a right-of-way casement for the construction, operation, and maintenance of submarine flow lines from Well No. 5, located on Phillips Petroleum Company and Pauley Petroleum Inc. Lease P.R.C. 2933.1, to an onshore point near Tajiguas, approximately 8 miles south of Gaviota (see Exhibit "A" following Calendar Item 22). Similar easements from Wells Nos. 1, 2, and 3 were approved by the Commission at the July 25, 1963, meeting.

This line will cross the northwest portion of Lease P.R.C. 2198.1, which was issued to Standard Oil Company of California, and Phillips Petroleum has submitted copies of statements of nonobjection on the part of Standard Oil of California as to the crossing of its lease. Based on a \$300-per-acre valuation of the tide and submerged lands for the easement area involved in crossing Lease P.R.C. 2198.1, the annual rental for a 49-year easement has been determined to be \$160.10.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO PHILLIP. PETROLEUM COMPANY A 49-YEAR EASEMENT, AT AN ANNUAL RENTAL OF \$160.10 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF SUBMARINE FLOW LINES OVER TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS OF THE SANTA BARBARA CHANNEL, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:
