#### MINUTE ITEM

35. PROPOSAL BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH TO EXPEND TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MARINE PARK - L.B.W.O. 10,205.

After consideration of Supplemental Calendar Item 37 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT THE PROPOSED EXPENDITURE BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH DATED AUGUST 28, 1964, OF APPROXIMATELY \$254,000, AS SHOWN ON ATTACHED EXHIBIT "A", FROM ITS SHARE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR CONSTRUCTION OF MARINE PARK ON OR ADJACENT TO THE LONG BEACH TIDELANDS OR ON OR ADJACENT TO AQUATIC RECREATIONAL AREAS IS IN ACCORDANCE AND CONFORMANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 138, STATUTES OF 1964, 1ST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION; SAID DETERMINATION TO BE SUBJECT TO THE CONDITIONS, HOWEVER, THAT THE WORK CONFORM IN ESSENTIAL DETAILS TO THE PLANS AND BACKGROUND MATERIAL HERETOFORE SUBMITTED.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL CALENDAR ITEM

PROFOSAL BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH TO EXPEND TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MARINE PARK - L.B.W.O. 10,205.

On August 28, 1964, the City of Long Beach, through the office of the City Attorney, filed a letter of intent to expend a portion of its share of tideland oil revenues in the amount of \$254,000, pursuant to the authority of Chapter 138/64, 1st E.S., for the construction of a marine park on the south shore of the Marine Stadium immediately west of the J. H. Davies Bridge. Revised preliminary plans B-127 requested by the staff was transmitted on October 7, 1964. Refer to Exhibits "A", "B", "C" and "D" for an estimate and description of the work.

As required by Chapter 138, the City, in its letter of August 28, 1964, specified Section 6(d) as the particular subdivision which the City deems applicable to an authorization of the work. Section 6(d) of Chapter 138, Statutes of 1964, 1st E.S., is repeated hereinafter for the information and convenience of the Commission. Marine stadiums, marine parks, beaches and related facilities on or adjacent to the Long Beach Tidelands or on or adjacent to aquatic recreational areas are specifically authorized in the language.

Sec. 6. The Legislature hereby finds that the remaining oil revenue hereinabove allocated to the City of Long Beach is needed and can be economically utilized by said city for the fulfillment of the trust uses and purposes described in said acts of 1911, 1925 and 1935 and described as follows in this act, which are hereby found to be matters of state, as distinguished from local, interest and benefit.

 (d) The construction, reconstruction, repair, operation and maintenance of small boat harbors, marine stadiums, maritime museum, marine parks, beaches, waterways, and related facilities, on or adjacent to the Long Beach tidelands or on or adjacent to the Alamitos Beach Park Lands, or on or adjacent to aquatic recreational areas of the aforesaid nature.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION DETERMINE THAT THE PROFOSED EXPENDITURE BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH DATED AUGUST 28, 1964, OF APPROXIMATELY \$254,000, AS SHOWN ON ATTACHED EXHIBIT "A", FROM ITS SHARE OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUES FOR CONSTRUCTION OF MARINE PARK ON OR ADJACENT TO THE LONG BEACH TIDELANDS OF ON OR ADJACENT TO AQUATIC RECREATIONAL AREAS IS IN ACCORDANCE AND CONFORMANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 138, STATUTES OF 1964, 1ST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION; SAID DETERMINATION TO BE SUBJECT TO THE CONDITIONS, HOWEVER, THAT THE WORK CONFORM IN ESSENTIAL DETAILS TO THE PLANS AND BACKGROUND MATERIAL HERETOFORE SUBMITTED.
