16. APPLICATION FUR PROSPECTING FERMIT, SAN BERNARDING COUNTY; AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING COMPANY - W.O. 5431, P.R.C. 3305.2.

After consideration of Calendar Item 30 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

PURSUANT 10 SECTION 6891 OF THE FUBLIC RESOURCES CODE, THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED IN ISSUE TO AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING COMPANY A TWO-YEAR PROSFECTING PERM T AUTHORIZING IROSPECTING FOR MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS ON LOT 13, CONTAINING 18.31 ACRES OF VACANT STATE SCHOOL LAND IN SECTION 16, T. 10 N., R. 1 E., S.B.B.& M., SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY.

ROYALTY PAYABLE UNDER ANY PREFERENTIAL LEASE ISSUED UPON DISCOVERY OF COMMER-CIALLY VALUABLE DEFOSITS OF MINERALS, UPON ANY AND ALL MINERALS PRODUCED, EXTRACTED, OR SOLD FROM SAID LEASE PREMISES, TO BE DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

1. FOR GOLD, SILVER, OTHER PRECIOUS MINERALS, AND RADIOACTIVE MINERALS

$$R = 3.00 + .01 (C - 20.00)^2$$

2. FOR NOWPRECIOUS METALLIC MINERALS

$$R = 3.00 + 0.37 (c - 60.00)$$

3. FOR NONMETALLIC MINERALS

WHERE R = ROYALTY IN DOLLARS AND CENTS PER TON OF ORE

C = VELIHTED AVERAGE OF GROSS SALES PRICE PER TON OF ORW DETERMINED BY THE ACTUAL GROSS SALES VALUE OF THE ORE SOLD ON A QUARTERLY BASIS DURING THE FIRST YEAR OF THE LUNCE, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER THE WEIGHTED AVERAGE TO BE DETERMINED BY THE ACTUAL CROSS SALES VALUE OF THE ORE SOLD DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

A 72-73 S 36 THE MAXIMUM ROYALTY FOR GOLD, SILVER, OTHER PRECIOUS MINERALS, AND RADIO-ACTIVE MINERALS SHALL NOT EXCEED 50 PERCENT OF THE AVERAGE GROSS SALES PRICE OF THE ORE.

THE MAXIMUM ROYALTY FOR ALL NONPRECIOUS METALLIC AND NONMETALLIC MINERALS SHALL NOT EXCEED 25 PERCENT OF THE AVERAGE GROSS SALES PRICE OF THE ORE.

APPLICATION FOR PROSPECTING PERMIT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY; AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING COMPANY - W.O. 5431.

An application has been received from American Smelting and Refining Company for a permit to prospect for minerals other than oil and gas on Lot 13, containing 18.31 acres of vacant State school land within Section 16, T. 10 N., R. 1 E., S.B.B.& M., San Bernardino County, as shown on U. S. Supplemental Plat approved June 13, 1931.

Section 6891 of the Public Resources Code provides for the issuance to a qualified applicant of a prospecting permit for lands which are not known mineral lands.

The applicant proposes to prospect and explore the land for silver, barite, and other ores by crenching and drilling and, if such ores are discovered in quantity and quality, to apply for a lease.

The proposed prospect area lies within the Calico mining district. The applicant is presently exploring the Waterloo group of patented mining claims to the west and the surrounding unpatented claims. A field recornaissance of the area has established that the land sought is not known to contain commercially valuable deposits of minerals. The statutory filing fee has been paid, and the permit fee has been deposited by the applicant.

As required under Section 6890 of the Public Resources Code, the application has referred to the office of the Attorney General, which office has advised that the application complies with the applicable less and the Rules and Regulations of the State Lands Commission.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT, PURSUANT TO SECTION 6891 OF THE PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE, THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING COMPANY A TWO-YEAR PROSPECTING PERMIT AUTHORIZING PROSPECTING FOR MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS ON LOT 13, CONTAINING 18.31 ACRES OF VACANT STATE SCHOOL LAND IN SECTION 10, T. 10 N., R. 1 E., S.B.B.& M., SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY.

THE MAXIMUM ROYALTY FOR GOLD, SILVER, OTHER PRECIOUS MINERALS, AND RADIO-ACTIVE MINERALS SHALL NOT EXCEED 50 PERCENT OF THE AVERAGE GROSS SALES PRICE OF THE CRE.

THE MAXIMUM ROYALTY FOR ALL NONPRECIOUS METALLIC AND NONMETALLIC MINERALS SHALL NOT EXCEED 25 PERCENT OF THE AVERAGE GROSS SALES PRICE OF THE ORE.
