The Department of the Army, Corps of Engineers, has applied for a permit to deposit approximately 690,000 cubic yards of dry fill material on tide and submerged lands of Doheny Beach State Park as indicated by the hatching on Exhibit "A". The material will be trucked into the area from a source near Camp Pendleton.

The project is designed to replenish the beach area with sand fill for use of the public. Consideration for the permit will therefore be the public benefit.

The permit is requested for a six-month period beginning September 1, 1965.
