17. WITHDRAWAL OF PROSPECTING PERMIT FOR GEOTHERMAL ENERGY, LAKE COUNTY; S. I. CORPORATION - W.O. 5337.

After consideration of Calendar Item 14 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION RESCINDS THE MAY 27, 1965, AUTHORIZATION FOR THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO S. I. CORPORATION A TWO-YEAR PROSPECTING PERMIT AUTHORIZING PROSPECTING FOR GEOTHERMAL ENERGY, FOR MINEPAL WATERS, FOR NONHYDROCARBON GASES, AND FOR ALL MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS ON SUBMERGED LANDS UNDERLYING CLEAR LAKE IN LAKE COUNTY AS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED.

WITHDRAWAL OF PROSPECTING PERMIT FOR GEOTHERMAL ENERGY, LAKE COUNTY; S. I. CORPORATION - W.O. 5337.

An application was received on September 10, 1964, from S. I. Corporation for a permit to prospect for geothermal energy, for all minerals other than oil and gas, and for mineral waters on submerged lands underlying Clear Lake as described in Exhibit "A" attached.

Section 6891 of the Public Resources Code provides for the issuance to a qualified applicant of a prospecting permit for lands which are not known mineral lands.

On May 27, 1965 (Minute Item 19, page 11,261), pursuant to Section 6891 of the Public Resources Code, the Commission authorized the Executive Officer to issue to S. A. Corporation a two-year prospecting permit authorizing prospecting for geothermal energy, for mineral waters, for nonhydrocarbon gases, and for all minerals other than oil and gas, in 600 acres of submerged land underlying Char Lake, Lake County.

On October 21, 1964, the form of prospecting permit was mailed to S. I. Corporation for review.

On June 10, 1965, the permit was transmitted to the applicant, S. I. Corporation. Since that time the applicant has declined to execute acceptance of the permit.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION RESCIND THE MAY 27, 1965, AUTHORIZATION FOR THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO S. I. CORPORATION A TWO-YEAR PROSPECTING PERMIT AUTHORIZANG PROSPECTING FOR GEOTHERMAL ENERGY, FOR MINERAL: WATERS, FOR NONHYDROCARBON GASES, AND FOR ALL MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS ON SUBMERGED LANDS UNDERLYING CLEAR LAKE IN LAKE COUNTY AS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED.
