8. APPLICATION FOR SUBMARINE CABLE EASEMENT IN PACIFIC OCEAN AT ENTRANCE TO SAN FRANCISCO BAY, SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY; TWELFTH U. S. COAST GUARD DISTRICT -W.O. 5097, P.R.C. 3436.9.

After consideration of Calendar Item 40 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO THE COMMANDER, TWELFTH U. S. COAST GUARD DISTRICT, A 49-YEAR EASEMENT, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE FUBLIC BENEFIT, FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF AN EXISTING SUBMARINE CABLE ACROSS THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED LAND:

A STRIP OF SUBMERGED LAND 20 FEET WIDE IN THE PACIFIC OCEAN, CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO; BEING 10 FEET ON EACH SIDE OF THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED CENTERLINE:

COMMENCING AT AN 8" \times 8" CONCRETE MONUMENT NEAR THE MOUTH OF LOBOS CREEK, SAID MONUMENT HAVING CALIFORNIA ZONE 3 COORDINATES OF X = 1,426,639.14, Y = 475,960.26; THENCE N. 75° 20' E. 142 FEET MORE OR LESS TO A POWER POLE; THENCE N. 54° 46' W. 365.6 FEET TO A FOINT IN THE PACIFIC OCEAN, SAID POINT BEING THE TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING OF THIS DESCRIPTION; THENCE N. 83° 25' W. APPROXIMATELY 7,075 FEET TO A POINT ON THE MEAN HIGH TIDE LINE OF THE PACIFIC OCEAN ON THE EASTERLY SIDE OF MILE ROCK; CONTAINING 3.25 ACRES MORE OR LESS.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM ANY PORTION OF THE AREA INCLUDED IN AN ACT (STATUTES OF 1897, CHAPTER 81) RELINQUISHING TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA THE TITLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA TO CERTAIN LANDS ADJACENT TO LANDS RESERVED FOR MILITARY PURPOSES.

THE BEARINGS AND DISTANCES USED IN THE ABOVE DESCRIPTION ARE BASED ON THE CALIFORNIA COORDINATE SYSTEM ZONE 3.

APPLICATION FOR SUBMARINE CABLE EASEMENT IN PACIFIC OCEAN AT ENTRANCE TO SAN FRANCISCO BAY, SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY; TWELFTH U. S. COAST GUARD DISTRICT -W.O. 5097.

The Commander, Twelfth U. S. Coast Guard District, San Francisco, has applied for an easement for an existing submarine cable in a 20 x 7,075-foot strip of ungranted sovereign land in the Pacific Ocean, between Baker's Beach and Mile Rock on the southerly side of the entrance to San Francisco Bay (as shown on Exhibit 'A").

The cable supplies power to the Mile Rock Light Station and ties to a power line owned by the U. S. Department of the Army at its Baker's Beach Pumping Station.

The easement term will be 49 years, and the consideration will be the public benefit.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE COMMANDER, EWELFY: U. S. COAST GUARD DISTRICT, A 49-YEAR EASE-MENT, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC BENEFIT, FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF AN EXISTING SUBMARINE CABLE ACROSS THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED LAND:

A STRIP OF SUBMERGED LAND 20 FEET WIDE IN THE PACIFIC OCEAN, CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO; BEING 10 FEET ON EACH SIDE OF THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED CENTERLINE:

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EXCEPTING THEREFROM ANY PORTION OF THE AREA INCLUDED IN AN ACT (STATUTES OF 1897, CHAPTER 81) RELINCUISHING TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA THE TITLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA TO CERTAIN LANDS ADJACENT TO LANDS RESERVED FOR MILITARY PURPOSES.

THE BEARINGS AND DISTANCES USED IN THE ABOVE DESCRIPTION ARE BASED ON THE CALIFORNIA COORDINATE SYSTEM ZONE 3.
