APPLICATION FOR DREDGING PERMIT, SUBMERGED LANDS, CLEAR LAKE, LAKE COUNTY; DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, OFFICE OF ARCHITECTURE AND CONSTRUCTION - W.O. 6188.

An application has been received from the Department of General Services, Office of Architecture and Construction, for a permit to dredge approximately 190,000 cubic yards of material from State land in Clear Lake and place it upon adjacent State park land. The requested dredging is for the purpose of shoreline development of the adjacent State park land.

The application has the approval of the Department of Parks and Recreation. The Department of Fish and Game has reviewed the application and requests that the following conditions be included in the permit:

- 1. All dredged material will be land-disposed, as indicated in the application.
- 2. Dredging operations will be conducted in a manner to conform with water quality standard, as established by the Water Quality Control Board.
