2. APPLICATION FOR DREDGING PERMIT, SUBMERGED LANDS, CLEAR LAKE, LAKE COUNTY; BOARD OF SUPERVISORS - W.O. 5966, P.R.C. 3624.9.

After consideration of Calendar Item 39 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO THE LAKE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS A PERMIT TO DREDGE APPROXIMATELY 1300 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL, WITHOUT PAYMENT OF ROYALTY, FROM A PORTION OF THE BED OF CLEAR LAKE, LAKE COUNTY, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT A BRASS CAP SET IN CONCRETE BY THE CALIFORNIA DIVISION OF STATE LAND IN 1965, WITHIN SECTION 27, TOWNSHIP 14 NORTH, RANGE 9 WEST, M.D.B. & M., AND DESIGNATED AS "LAKE SIDE", CALIFORNIA COORDINATE SYSTEM, ZONE 2 COORDINATES OF WHICH $X = 1,759,494.51$ AND $Y = 497,348.86$, AND FROM SAID POINT, RUNNING THENCE SOUTH $64^{\circ} 12' 59''$ WEST, A DISTANCE OF 680.28 FEET TO A POINT ON THE LOW WATER LINE OF CLEAR LAKE, BEING THE TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING; AND RUNNING THENCE NORTH $35^{\circ} 32'$ WEST, A DISTANCE OF 223.00 FEET; THENCE SOUTH $54^{\circ} 28'$ WEST, A DISTANCE OF 170.00 FEET; THENCE SOUTH $35^{\circ} 32'$ EAST, A DISTANCE OF 223.00 FEET; THENCE NORTH $54^{\circ} 28'$ EAST, A DISTANCE OF 170.00 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, CONTAINING 0.870 ACRES.

THE CONSIDERATION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF THIS PERMIT IS THE PUBLIC BENEFIT.

APPLICATION FOR DREDGING PERMIT, SUBMERGED LANDS, CLEAR LAKE, LAKE COUNTY;
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS - W.O. 5966.

An application has been received from the Board of Supervisors, Lake County, for a permit to dredge approximately 1300 cubic yards of material from State lands in Clear Lake. The spoils will be deposited upon adjacent county park lands. The requested dredging is to provide an entrance channel for a proposed harbor.

Section 6303 of the Public Resources Code provides that the Commission may grant the privilege of removing or extracting material from submerged lands owned by the State for improvement of navigation or reclamation upon such terms and conditions and for such consideration as will be for the best interests of the State.

The U. S. Corps of Engineers has stated verbally that a Department of the Army permit is not required to perform the dredging. The Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Beaches and Parks, urges that the scenic quality and shoreline be considered and protected by the conditions of the permit. The Department of Fish and Game has stated that it has no objection to the issuance of the permit provided the applicant complies with the following conditions:

1. All material is to be land disposed, as indicated in the application.
2. Dredging operations will be conducted in a manner to conform with water quality standard as established by the Water Quality Control Board.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE LAKE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS A PERMIT TO DREDGE APPROXIMATELY 1300 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL, WITHOUT PAYMENT OF ROYALTY, FROM A PORTION OF THE BED OF CLEAR LAKE, LAKE COUNTY, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:
