5. AUTHORIZATION TO EXTRACT MATERIAL, SAN DIEGO BAY, SAN DIEGO COUNTY;  
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, DIVISION OF BAY TOLL CROSSINGS - W.O. 6351,  
P.R.C. 3731.9.

After consideration of Calendar Item 31 attached, and upon motion duly made  
and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO APPROVE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVI-  
SIONS OF SECTION 101.5 OF THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE, THE MAPS SUBMITTED  
BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, DIVISION OF BAY TOLL CROSSINGS, DESCRIBING  
THE AREA OF SOVEREIGN LANDS IN GLORIETTA BAY, SAN DIEGO COUNTY, FROM WHICH IT  
IS PROPOSED TO EXTRACT APPROXIMATELY 885,000 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL IN CON-  
NECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE SAN DIEGO - CORONADO BRIDGE.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXTRACT MATERIAL, SAN DIEGO BAY, SAN DIEGO COUNTY;  
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, DIVISION OF BAY TOLL CROSSINGS - W.O. 6351.

An application has been received from the Department of Public Works, Division of Bay Toll Crossings, for a permit to dredge approximately 885,000 cubic yards from Glorietta Bay in San Diego County in connection with the construction of the San Diego - Coronado Bridge. The dredged material will be used to construct roadway embankments for the Coronado approach, and to provide new land for reconstructing a portion of the Coronado Municipal Golf Course. Extraction of the material will effect a proposed relocation of the Glorietta Bay Channel east of the existing channel location. All of the dredged material will be deposited either upon State lands or upon lands under the jurisdiction of the Division of Bay Toll Crossings or of the San Diego Unified Port District.

Section 101.5 of the Streets and Highways Code provides in part:

"The Department may file for record with the Division of State Lands of the Department of Finance such maps as are necessary to furnish an accurate description of any ungranted...bed of any navigable channel...or other sovereign lands of the State of California which, in the opinion of the Department are needed...as a source of materials for the construction, maintenance or improvement of any such highway. Upon the approval of such map by the Chief of said Division of State Lands, the lands described therein are reserved for such use by the Department and the Department is thereupon authorized to enter upon, occupy and use such lands for such purpose or purposes. Any subsequent grant or permission to use such lands shall be subordinate to such reservation. Any such reservation may be released by the written certificate of the Director filed with said Division of State Lands."

The required maps have been submitted by the Division of Bay Toll Crossings. The proposed dredge areas are located on ungranted State sovereign lands.

The U. S. Corps of Engineers has issued a Department of the Army permit authorizing the conduct of dredging at the location described in the application. The Division of Beaches and Parks has reported that the proposed dredging will not interfere with recreational use of lands littoral to the tidelands or submerged lands in the referenced application insofar as that Department is concerned. The Department of Fish and Game states that the project will not be detrimental to fish and wildlife resources of the area providing the dredge and fill operation is performed in a manner that will preclude excessive turbidity in the adjacent waters.

The San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board has issued a list of waste discharge requirements with which the applicant must comply and which will regulate the flow of the discharge of waters resulting from the operation into the bay.

The applicant has an agreement with the San Diego Unified Port District for utilization of the portion of the Port District's property that falls within the project boundary.
