30. QUITCLAIM, MINERAL EXTRACTION LEASE P.R.C. 3671.1, INYO COUNTY; MORRISON AND WEATHERLY CHEMICAL PRODUCTS - W.O. 6849.

After consideration of Calendar Item 28 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE TERMINATION, BY MUTUAL CONSENT OF THE STATE AND THE LESSEE, MORRISON AND WEATHERLY CHEMICAL PRODUCTS, OF MINERAL EXTRACTION LEASE P.R.C. 3671.1, COVERING 320 ACRES OF SOVEREIGN LAND IN OWENS LAKE, INYO COUNTY, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS THE WESTERN HALF OF SECTION 19, T. 17 S., R. 38 E., M.D.B. & M.; AND THAT THE ACCEPTANCE OF A QUITCLAIM OF THE AFOREMENTIONED LEASE IS AUTHORIZED, THE TERMINATION AND QUITCLAIM TO BE EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 5, 1967.
