3. TEN-YEAR PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT, SUBMERGED LAND IN SLOUGH ON RIGHT BANK OF SACRAMENTO RIVER NEAR HAMILTON CITY, GLENN COUNTY, FOR INSTALLATION OF FISH SCREEN AND BYPASS PIPELINE; STATE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME - W-8502, P.R.C. 4293.9.

After consideration of Calendar Item 6 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZES ISSUANCE TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A 10-YEAR PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT FROM AUGUST 1, 1969, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC BENEFIT, FOR INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF A FISH SCREEN AND A BYPASS PIPELINE ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF. SUCH AUTHORIZATION IS NOT TO BE CONSTRUED AS APPROVAL OF OR CONSENT TO OCCUPATION OF ANY STATE-OWNED LAND BY THE GLENN-COLUSA IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT

APPLICANT: State Department of Fish and Game.

LOCATION: 4.408 acres of submerged land in a slough on the right bank of the Sacramento River in Section 2, T. 22 N., R. 2 W., 6 miles NE of Hamilton City in Glenn County.

LAND USE: The installation and operation of a fish screen and bypass pipeline.

TERMS: 10 years, from August 1, 1969.

CONSIDERATION: No charge (the public benefit).

PREREQUISITE ITEMS: The Department of Fish and Game has the consent of the upland owner, Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, for this land use.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

- a. Public Resources Code: Div. 6, Pt. 2, Ch. 1, Secs. 6501-6509.
- b. Administrative Code: Title 2, Div. 3, Articles 1 and 2 as amended effective May 10, 1969.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The need for a fish screen at this site is caused by the construction of a diversion dam across the slough by Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District and by the use of a pump which redirects the fish into the irrigation facility.
- 2. A routine investigation by the Division has disclosed the following:
 - a. Existence of the dam may constitute a trespass on State land inasmuch as the Commission has not issued a permit. The Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District has not responded to a Division request for data regarding the dam.
 - b. The Army Corps of Engineers and the Reclamation Board require permits for the dam and the fish screen, but applications from the district therefor have not been received.

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3. The Division will pursue the matter of prerequisite permits for the dam and the fish screen. However, it is considered in the public interest to facilitate movement of the fish to and from their spawning areas and to minimize fish losses by authorizing installation of the fish screen and a bypass pipeline without further delay.

and lying between the prolongation of the west line of Lot 37
and the prolongation of the east line of Lot 39 of Subdivision
No. 1 of the Sacramento Colony Company's land in Capay Rancho,
according to the official map or plat thereof filed in the
office of the County Recorder of said County of Glenn, on the
13th day of March 1917, in Book 4 of Maps and Surveys, at
page 13.

To the extent that the same shall embrace the sovereign lands
of the State of California within the above description.
