After consideration of Calendar Item 3 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION AUTHORIZIES THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO EXECUTE AN APPROFRIATE STIPULATED JUDGMENT IN TIHE MATTER OT BERYLWOOD INVESTMENT COMPANY V. The United States, on behalf of the Bureau of Reclama'ion, has instituted a series of condemnation actions to acquire land for the purpose of creating the Cibola Cut along the Colorado River in the Palo Verde Valley area. In the case of U.S.A. V. 33.09 Acres, United States District Ccurt, Southern District of California, Southfrn Division, No. 3l37SDK-Civ., the State of California claimed a portion of Parcel 1 as sovereign lands of the State, leing the former bed of the Colorado River as it existed in 1930. The portion claimed by the State, amounting to approximately 8.5 acres of Parcel 1 , was part of the land that vas also the subject of a boundary line agreerent between the State of Valifomia and Berylwood Investment Company, authorized by the State Lands Commission on May 26, 1966 (Minute Item 34, pp. 12, 710-8), and which executed boundary line agreement is designated on the records of the State Lands Division as B.L.A. 75. The agreed roundary line follows the low water line along the right bank of the 1930 shannel of the Colorado River. The Aitorney General, pursuant to resolution adopted by the State Lands Commission on October 26, 1967 (Minute Item 49, pp. 1202-3), entered into a judgment and stipulation with the U. S. wherein the State receive . compensation of $\$ 1,125$ for the taking of sovereign land within the 1930 channel of the Colorado River and revesting title in the Staie to sovereign lands in said channel that were not finally condemned by the United States in the action.

At the request of a title insurance company representing Berylwood Investment Company, the zompany filed an action against the state to quiet title and confirm the boundary line agreement previously entered into between the State and Berylvood Investment Company. The State has filed an answer, claiming an easement for commerce, navigation and fisheries over whatever part of the plaintiff's land is under the navigable waters of the Colorado River, and a counterclaim setting up the State's claim to ownership of the $i 930$ bed of the river. It is now proposed that the Comission authorize the office of the Attorney Gereral to enter into an appropriate stipulated judgment in this action that will confirm the boundary line agreement heretofore entered into between the parties, confirm the ownersiip of the State of California in the former bed of the Coicrado River ( 1930 channel), and impose the easement for commerce, navigation and fisheries, over so much of, and for so long as a time as, the real property described in Exhibit "A" of the plaintiff's complaint is covered by navigable water:s of the Colorado River. These latter lands, although now covered by navigable waters of the Colorado Rivex, were artificially created, and the fee interest therein is not in the State of California. The river now runs through the Cibola Cut, and the water covering a portion of the plaintiff's land probably will dry up.

IT IS RECOMENDED THAT THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION AUTHORIZT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO EXECUTE AN APPROPRIATE STIPULATED JUDGMENT IN THE MATMTER OF
