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EXHIBIT "A"

A strip of tide and submerged land lying in the bed of the San Joaquin River, San Joaquin County, California, approximately 10 miles northwest of Holt, California, between McDonald Tract and Tule Island and lying 20 feet on each side of the following described line:

BEGINNING at a point from which a triangulation station marked "U.S.E. Columbia" as shown on U.S.G.S. Terminus Quadrangle, bears N. 78° W. 5,200 feet more or less, thence from said point of beginning N. 05° 30' W. 320 feet more or less to the end of the herein described centerline.

To the extent that same shall cross the tide and submerged land of the State of California within the bed of the San Joaquin River.
