PUBLIC AGENCY RIGHT-OF-ENTRY PERMIT

APPLICANT: Department of Public Works, Division of Highways.

LOCATION: A strip of land in the bed of the San Joaquin River at Highway 132, approximately 11 miles westerly of Modesto, Stanislaus County, containing one-quarter acre, more or less.

LAND USE: Construction and protection of a highway bridge.

TERMS: 2 years, from March 1, 1970.

CONSIDERATION: No charge (the public use and benefit).

PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

U. S. Army Corps of Engineers permit has been requested, and the Public Notice has cleared the Resources Agency with no objections.

Applicant is owner of upland.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$20.
- 2. The permit is necessary pending agreement with the Department of Public Works regarding a map form. It will be superseded by an application for a permanent permit, pursuant to Section 101.5 of the Streets and Highways Code.

EXHIBIT "A"

A parcel of land situate in the bed of the San Joaquin River lying northerly of the north line of that parcel of land shown on Sovereign Lands Map recorded January 31, 1961, in State Highway Map Book No. 2, page 1, Stanislaus County Records, and southerly of the following-described line:

BEGINNING at a point that is South 9,127.79 feet and West 4,451.51 feet from the northeast corner of Section 20, T. 3 S., R. 7 E., M.D.B.& M., said point also lies 170 feet left of Engineer's Station 131+00 of the Department of Public Works' 1969 Survey Centerline for State Highway Road 10-Sta-132, said corner having coordinates X = 1,793,602.57 feet and Y = 425,601.94 feet; thence N. 83° 29' 53" E., 350.04 feet to a point that is South 9,088.15 feet and West 4,103.72 feet from said Section 20, said point also lies 175 feet left of Engineer's Station 134+50 of said Department of Public Works' 1969 Survey Centerline, containing one-quarter acre, more or 1238.

Coordinates, bearings and distances used in the above description are based on the California Coordinate System, Zone 3.

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
