APPROVAL OF AN AMENDED BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION
OF THE PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS
TO THE CITY OF SANTA BARBARA, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

At its regular meeting on February 28, 1974, the State Lands Commission approved the legal description of the proposed annexation to the City of Santa Barbara as required by Government Code Section 35014. Subsequent to the approval, the Local Agency Formation Commission of Santa Barbara County requested the amendment of the approved description to include an area of tide and submerged lands omitted from the prior description. The purpose of the amendment is to close a gap that would exist between the jurisdictional boundaries of the present city limits of Santa Barbara and the proposed annexation.

At its regular August 29, 1974, meeting, the State Lands Commission considered the amended proposal. However, representatives of the Isla Vista Community Council objected to the proposed annexation. The State Lands Commission action of that date approved the legal description, but withheld consert to the annexation until the Santa Barbara County Local Agency Formation Commission made a decision on the boundary dispute between the City of Santa Barbara and the Isla Vista Community Council.

On October 24, 1974, Santa Barbara County Local Agency Formation Commission, by Resolution No. 74-380, approved LAFCO's Proposal No. 74-AC-1, allowing the annexation. Such resolution is on file in the office of the State Lands Division.

The Santa Barba a County Local Agency Formation Commission has again amended the proposed description to close a gap that existed in the prior description between the jurisdictional boundaries of the present city limits of Santa Barbara and the proposed annexation.

Pursuant to Section 35014 of the Government Code, the State Lands Commission is required to approve or disapprove a description of the boundary of the proposed annexation in respect to the included State-owned tide and submerged lands. The description of the boundaries has been reviewed by the Division and has been found to comply with Section 35014 of the Government Code.
