### APPROVAL OF A MARICULTURE RESHARCH AGREEMENT; PLATFORM HOLLY SANTA BARBARA COUNTY; CALIFORNIA MARINE ASSOCIATES AND 34. ATLANTIC RICHFIELD CORPORATION - W 9954, PRC 5133.

During consideration of Calendar Them 34 attached, Mr. William F. Northrop, read into the record a memorandum from Mr. E. G. Fullerton, Director of the State Department of Fish and Game, to Mr. William F. Northrop, Executive Officer, State Lands Commission, dated May 14, 1976, on file in the office of the State Lands Commission and by reference made a part hereof. Mr. Fullerton requested the Commission to approve the greement due to the possible beneficial effects which may be derived.

Mr. Hugh Statton, representing the California Marine Associates, (CALMA) appeared. Mr. Staton requested the following items be clarified:

- The provision in the lease which states that if Phase II is successful, the parties may jointly 1) undertake a commercial venture for abalone mariculture at Holly, under the terms and conditions determined "at that time"; and
- When speaking of "Holly", does it mean at Platform Holly itself or on the whole lease. 21

With regard to No. 1, Mr. Staton stated it was his understanding the terms and conditions have already been determined and are set forth in the Agreement with ARCO.

Mr. D. J. Everitts, Manager, Energy and Mineral Resources Development, stated that if Platform Holly were used for a commercial-type venture, the Commission would have to again review and act on it in terms of the contract. He explained that the term "Holly" means the general area on Holly.

Mr. N. Gregory Taylor, Assistant Attorney General, indicated that he had not legally reviewed the subject agreement. However, he stated the main concern of the Commission is that no commercial operations are commenced without the Commission's, prior approval due to the potential effect on Holly. The staff therefore wants to review the project again before the applicant continues on to the commercial phase. He explained that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the effect it will have on the platform or any facility or upon our operations with regard to oil and gas. Mr. Staton assured the Commission that neither Phase I nor Phase II would have

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an adverse effect on Hoily. He stated they did not plan on using Holly for a commercial conture, but only for a study to accumulate information concerning the possibilities for a commercial venture near Holly.

Due to the hardship which would be imposed on CALMA if the item were deferred one month, the irman Cory questioned whether language could be amended into the Agreement whereby the Commission could tentatively approve the item subject to final negotiations between the staff and CALMA.

Mr. Paul Sucato representing ARCO, appeared. Mr. Sucato stated that he is not in position to say whether or not ARCO would approve the project as a result of this meeting. However, he requested that the staff review their proposal in time for the matter to appear on the June calendar. This would expedite consideration by ARCO concerning the continuation of the project.

After discussing the matter at longth, the following amended language was suggested by Mr. Taylor and approved by the Commission by a vote of 5.9:

At the ond of Recommendation #3:

". . . and provided that the work done pursuant to said agreement shall not incorfere with the oil and gas operations conducted on State fill and Gas Leases 3242.1

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### APPROVAL OF A MARICULTURE RESEARCH AGREEMENT

- APPLICANT: California Marine Associatos (CALMA) P. O. Box 136 Cayacos, California 93430
- LESSEE: Atlantic Richfield Corporation P. O. Box 147 Bakersfield, Julifornia 93302

AGREEMENT: Use by CALMA of Atlantic Richfield (ARCO) Platform Holly on State Oil and Gas Lease PRC 3842 at Santa Barbara for research on mariculture of marine shellfish (abalone),

### OTHER PERTINENT DATA:

1. The object of the research program is to evaluate abalone culture techniques with the prospect of developing a commercial operation as Platform Holly. The proposed agreement provides for a phased research project. Phase I will evaluate the use of containment devices and the growth characteristics of abalone under controlled conditions.

The proposed operations will include the placement of 9 devices containing 3,000 juvenile (2 to 3-inch) abalone at depths of 29 feet to 162 feet. (Nater depth at Holly is approximately 208 feet.) Feeding of the abalone, with chopped kelp, would have dependent times from the deck be done through feeder lines from the deck of the rlatform. This phase of the project will last approximately one year and will he financed by a grant of \$180,000 from Ar of to CALMA. If the results of Phase I are encouraging, the project will be extended for an additional year and ARCO will provide \$235,000 for Phase II. During this phase the project will be expanded to approximately 30,000 abalone. If Phase II 15 necessful, the parties may jointly andertake a commercial venture for abaione mariculture it fully, or elsewhere, under terms and conditions to be determined at that time. Any agreement for commercial production involving the use of Holly will require further Commission approval.

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- At full operation it is expected that approximately 1,000,000 abalene could be under mariculture, yielding a harvest of 250,000, 5 1/2 to 6 inches per abalene per year. It is estimated that the marketable size will be reached in 4 years.
- 3. Pursuant to Section 6491 of the Fish and Game Code, an offer for Mariculture Lease was prepared by the Department of Fish and Game and bids were received subsequent to February 30, 1976. The high bid of \$12.50 per acre per year was submitted by CALMA and the award will be made by the Fish and Game Commission on May 28, 1976. The lease covering 4 acres surrounding Platform Holly will be issued for an initial term of 5 years with an option to renew the lease for 2 additional 5-year periods. If the project proves successful, the royalty consideration will be subject to negotiation at the time of renewal.
- 4. The approval of the research agreement between ARCO and CALMA by the State Lands Commission (s required under the terms of State Oil and Gas lease PRC 3842. A permit to conduct such operation is also pending before the South Central Coastal Regional Commission.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT CONSIDERATION: 1. This transaction is for the collection of biological information to assess the feasibility of such operations on Platform Holly. Therefore, it is categorically exempt from the previsions of CEOA.

2. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values, pursuant to Public Resources inde 6370.1, and is classified in a significant use category, Class B: Limited Use. Staff review indicates that there will be no significant effect upon the identified environmental values.
