PROPOSED GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES LEASE OF RESERVED MINERAL INTERESTS, SONOMA COUNTY

It is proposed that the Commission offer for lease by competitive public bid 440 acres of land in which the minerals are reserved to the State. The parcel is located in Sonoma County adjacent to the Geysers Steam Field.

Section 6912(b) of the Public Resources Code, provides that a known geothermal resources area shall contain at least one well capable of producing geothermal resources in commercial quantities.

The State parcel is located in the northwestern edge of the geothermal area. It is underlain by the same type of rocks that occur in the proven steam fields. Fies on structural trend with the steam fields, and is adjacent to commercial geothermal wells as close as 250 feet. There are six producing steam wells within one half mile of the State parcel, and P.G. RE.'s power plant No. Il is located approximately 1,000 feet from the State parcel and is operating with steam from these and other hearby producing wells. It is the Staff's opinion that the criteria listed above satisfy the requirements of the Public Resources Code and that the State parcel should be declared to be within a known geothermal resources area (KGRA). State Leases PRG 4596 and PRC 4597, adjacent to the State Parcel, were declared to be KGRA lands by the State Lands Commission in May 1971. It is recommended that the limits of the KGRA be extended to include the State parcel.

Pursuant to Séction 6912(8) of the Public Resources Code, lands within a KGRA may be leased by competitive public bid on the basis of cash bonus, net profit or other biddable factor. The State parcel is adjacent to leases that were recently put up for bid by the Federal Government. The cash bonus on these leases ranged from \$25.89 to \$478.31 per acre.

Section 6922, of the Public Resources Code, provides that the surface landowner may, within 10 days after notification by the Commission, submit a bid identical to the highest acceptable bid, in which case the Commission shall issue a lease to such surface landowner. If the surface landowner does not file such a bid, then the Commission may proceed with the award of the bid.

An Environmental Impact Report was prepared by the Sonoma County Planning Commission covering geothermal development in the area including the State parcel. The impacts of the project proposed by the staff are essentially the same as the impacts covered by the EIR. By Notice of Determination

issued on February 26, 1976, the Sonoma County Planning Commission certified that (1) the Environmental Impact Report was prepared pursuant to the provisions of the California was prepared pursuant to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended; (2) the profect will not have a significant effect on the environment; ject will not have a significant effect on the environment; and (3) the project has been approved by the Sonoma County and (3) the project has been approved by the Sonoma County Planning Commission. The Notice of Determination has been filed with the Secretary for Resources, the State Lands filed with the Secretary Clerk for Sonoma County, wherein the project is to be undertaken.

The draft Environmental Impact Report was circulated through the State Clearinghouse, as required by the State EFR Guide-lines (14 Cal. Adm. Gode), and was also made available to interested Rederal and local government agencies as well as interested Rederal and local government agencies as well as the public. - 5. AUTHORIZE THE STAFF TO OFFER, PURSUANT TO LIVISION 6 OF THE PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE, FOR BID FOR THE EXTRACTION OF GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED PARCEL:
