31. TERMINATION OF EXPLORATORY PERMIT - PCC 4034.1 - WP 4934.

During consideration of Calendar frem 31, attached, Commissional terriage Sid McCausland recommended that in the future the staff not enter into these types of permits. Robert C. Hight, Chief Counsel, explained this is the only permit of its kind in existence. Mr. McCausland also recommended that rental, which has been paid for the new permit be returned to the applicant.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution as amended was adopted by a vote of 3-0.

KENWORTHY WITH SIXTY DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE DATE OF SAID TERMINATION AS PROVIDED IN PRC 4934. L. WITH THE STIPULATION THAT THE RENTAL FOR THE NEW TERM BE RETURNED TO THE APPLICANT.

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TERMINATION OF EXPLORATORY PERMIT P.R.C. 4934.4

The State, acting by and through the State Lands Commission, and Charles A. Kenworthy, dba The Quest, entered into an exploratory permit on August 8, 1974. The purpose of the permit was to authorize Mr. Kenworthy to undertake exploratory operations to locate and identify abandoned personal property on two parcels of State-owned tide and submerged lands of the Pacific Ocean off Santa Catalina Island, Los Angeles County, containing 9347 acres,

Specion 14 of the permit stages that it is the intent of the Rermittee (Kenworthy) upon discovery and identification of netrolliproperty of value to request a salwage permit from the Stage bands Commission.

To this date, Mr. Kenworthy has not applied for a salvage permit for any items discovered within the exploratory permit area. In fact, Mr. Kenworthy's attorney has indicated to staff of the Division that he has found some attems of personal property, but does not desire to apply for a salvage permit pursuant to the terms of the exploratory permit and State Lands Commission Regulations.

It is the present policy of the State Lunds Commission, as outlined in Article 2.5 of the State Lands Commission's Regulations to issue only salvage permits for the recovery of specifically located stems of property rather than to issue exploratory permits in order to search for unlocated items of property. In furtherance of this policy, the Commission no longer issues exploratory permits.

By the terms the permit was authorized for a permod of one year with right of renewal for two additional one year periods. Mr. Kenworthy completed the original one year period and one of the renewal periods and has now applied for the second renewal period.

The permit also states that it may be terminated upon sixty days notice based upon either Permitteens default or the State's determination that such termination would be for the best interests of the State.

The State Lands Division has received a salvage permit application for an area located within Mr. Kenworthy's exploration permit.

## CALENDAR LIEM NO. 31. (GONTO)

Because of the Commission's policy favoring salvage permits and because no salvage permit applications have been forthcoming from Mr. Kenworthy, it is felt that it would be in the best interest of the State to terminate Mr. Kenworthy's exploratory permit and to proceed with the issuance of salvage permits to other qualified applicants.
