GENERAL PERMIT PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT:

Department of Fish and Game 1001 Jed Smith Drive Sacramento, California 95819

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Approximately 2.07 acres of navigable waterway in the bed of the Mokelumne River downstream from Camanche Dam in San Joaquin County.

LAND USE:

Construction and maintenance of gravel and cobble weirs for salmon spawning areas.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial period:

49 years from February 1, 1978.

CONSIDERATION:

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N: The public use and benefit, with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

A. Public Resources Code: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.

B. Administrative Code: Title 2, Div. 3, Arts. 1, 2, 10 & 11.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$100.
- 2. The Department of Fish and Game proposes to alter the bed of the Mokelumne River in order to construct new salmon spawning areas at this location in order to increase and improve fish production.
- 3. An EIR is not required. This project is exempt from CEOA under Section 15104 of the State EIR Guidelines, Class 4(d) which allows minor alterations in land, water and vegetation for improvement

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of habitat for fish and wildlife resources.

4. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class B which authorizes Limited Use.

Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations who nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. They have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.

Peclamation Board, November, 1977; United States Army Corps of Engineers, December, 1976; and Water Quality, December, 1977.

AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A 49-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM FEBRUARY 1, 1978; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF GRAVEL AND COBBLE WEIRS FOR SALMON SPAWNING AREAS ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.
