REFORESTATION PROJECT TRIAL PLANTINGS

BACKGROUND:

Federal Title II funding of the first phase of a Statewide reforestation project on State-owned school lands was approved by the State Legislature in January. Minute Item No. 38 for January, 1978 authorized the execution of a contract with Employment Development Department (referee for the Title II Funds) for the remainder of fiscal

The proposed contracts for this phase of the project are on file with the State Lands Commission's Staff. These contracts obligate the Department of Forestry to provide consultation, expertise and supervision of site preparation and planting activities, and the California Conservation Corps to prepare and plant under the direction of CDF and the Commission's Staff. Each contract is for \$20,000.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The program for the period, ending June 30, 1978, will entail an examination and evaluation of many north State school land parcels for possible planting in fiscal year 1978-79. It will also include planting trials on 3 separate parcels of school land. The purpose of planting the Truckee site is to establish a permanent experimental plantation near Prosser Reservoir off Highway 89 northeast of Truckee, Nevada County. This site is not high quality, but contains areas typical of many school land parcels to be planted in ensuing years. The Fourthwater Creek site will entail planting seedlings among already naturally-regenerated seeflings on a cut-over parcel of approx mately 30 acres near Bucks Lake (Plumas County). The Ferris Creek site will entail replanting portions of a burned over area partially planted last year, south of Honey Lake (Plumas County). Reforestation of the latter

2 parcels was approved by the Commission in March, 1977 (Minute Item No. 11). In addition, at the Ferris Creek site, it may be necessary to enter into a road use agreement with the U.S.F.S.

Plantings are tentatively scheduled for April 3 on the Truckee site, April 15 on Fertis Creek and May 15 on Fourthwater Greek. Dates will be confirmed by CDF Service Foresters.

Minimal ground clearance and site preparation will be required on all 3 sites. This factor was key to selection of the sites for the inicial plantings.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

This project is exempt from CEQA because it entails superficial disturbance to the soil, is for information collection purposes, and is directed toward improvement of natural resources.

Authority Resources Agency Guidelines, Section 15104, 15106, and 15107.

This project is situated on school lands not identified as possessing significant environmental values. A staff tevlew of available environmental information indicates no reason to Identify the subject school land parcel as having such values at this time.
