## SHELL BETA DEVELOPMENT ELR

The Sholl oin Company proposes to develop 5 parcels in the Federal Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) which were acquired in Lease Sale 35. The paccels are located approximately 9 milles offshore in San Pedro Bay near the commaties of Seal Beach and Huntington Beach, Los Angetea County. At present, the developmint would include 2 froduction platforms, 1 processing platform, pipelines betwem such platerms and an oil transport pipeline to upland sacilities (sumge tank, refineries, etc.). The production transportation pipeline route wowld cross Federal bCS lands and enter State waters about 3 miles south of the Belmenin rium, pass around the east end of tong Beach breakwater, cross the long Beach outer hartor to point near the south side of Island Chaffee, follow the southern edge of the Thums undersea pipeline corridor, come ashore near the Queen Mary and thence pass overland to a point near the Thums manifold at Broadway and Mitchell Streets in the Rort of Long Beach.

The State tands Commission and the Port of long Beach are currenty functioning as a "co-1ead agency" in the preparation of the environmental impact report for the shell oil develupment. At its mecting of Februaxy 23, 1978, the State Lands Commission authorized the Executive Officer to negotiate and sign an agrement with the Port of Long Beach, Los Angeles County wht sh would gevern the sbove mentioned process.

The staffs of the Commsion and the Port have ratexmined that the EIR should be prepared by a private consulting organization(s) under a contract arrangement with the State Lands Commission. In ofder to solicit bids from such firms for the preparation of an EIR a request for proposal. (RFP) must be developed and circulated, The stafes of the Commission and the port have jointly developed an appropriate RFP and a list of prospective rectpients.

Further, the provisions of the Resource Agency Gutdeltnes for the implementation of the California Environmental Quadily Act of 19.70 , as amended, and the Commiston's Artfele 10 contained within Title 2 , Division 3 of the California Administrative Code stipulate that all costs fox the preparation, etc. of an EIR shall be botne by the pojeot applicant.
