of said Block 2; thence along the westerly prolongation of the southerly line of said Block 2, S 83° 41' 35" W, 12.00 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING of said line; said strip of land being 20.00 feet in width lying 10.00 feet on each side of the following three courses:

3. S 06° 34' 03" E, 80.00 feet;
4. S 09° 05' 00" E, 747.22 feet;
5. along a curve concave to the east having a radius of

300.00 feet, through a central angle of 7° 38' 19", an arc distance of 40.00 feet to the end of said 20.00-foot in width strip and the beginning of strip of land 100.00 feet in width lying 40.00 feet westerly and 60.00 feet easterly of the following course: thence continuing along said curve through a central angle of 32° 19' 21", an arc distance of 164.24 feet to the end of said 100.00-foot in width strip and the beginning of a strip of land 20.00 feet in width lying 10.00 feet on each side of the following course: thence S 4° 25' 40" E, 56.95 feet to the end of the herein described line.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the ordinary high water mark of the Yuba River.

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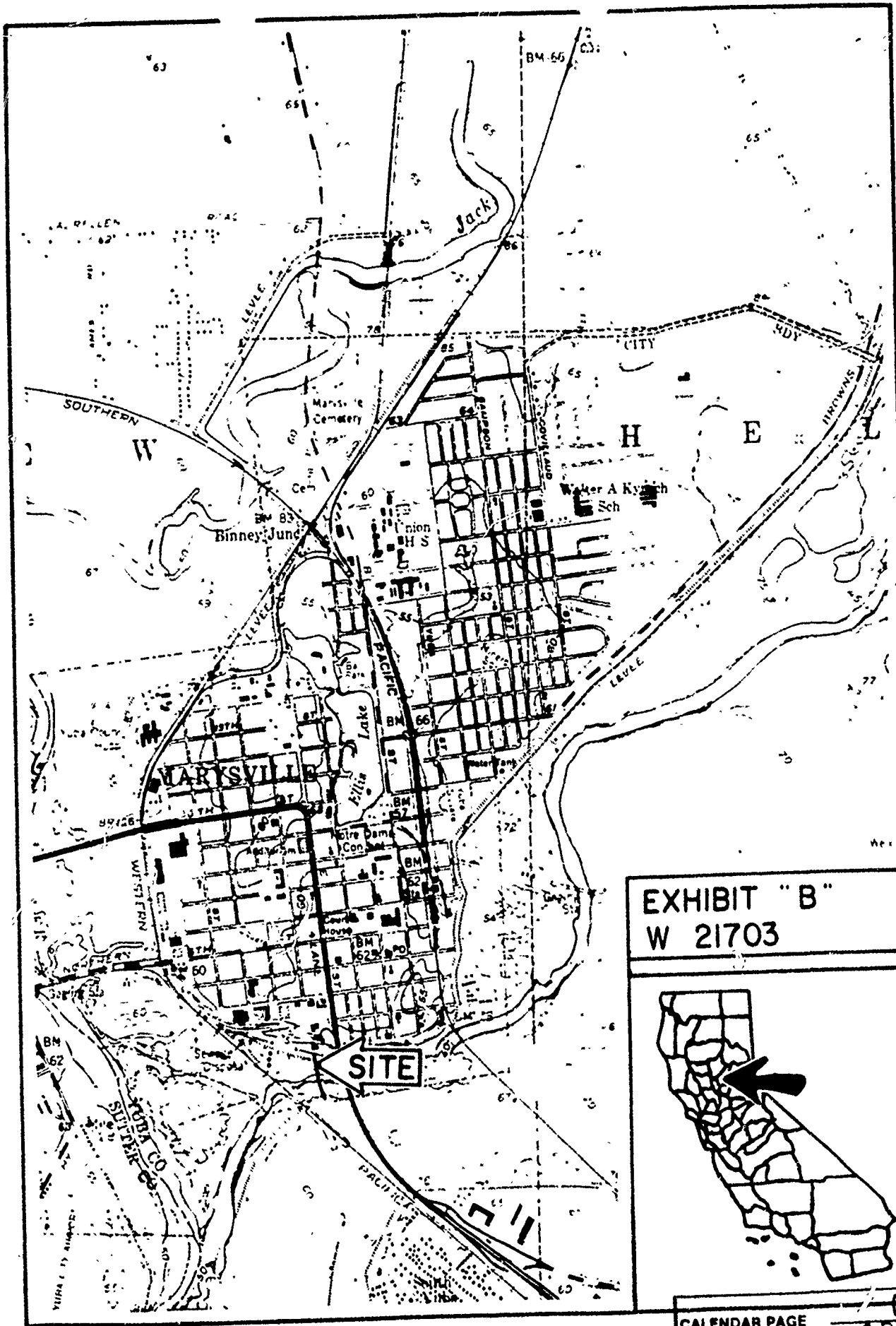

The Environmental Protection Committee has completed an initial Assessment of Environmental Impact of the following project and this Assessment is made a part of this Declaration:

Application: Conditional Use Permit 78-14-CUP

Applicant: Pacific Telephone  
939 Live Oak Blvd  
Yuba City, CA 95991

Project Description: Proposed excavation and placement of telephone conduit and access manholes on Tax Assessor's Parcel No. 20-020-02 & 03 located in the A-1-R Zone in south Marysville and the flood plain of the Yuba River, west of Highway 70. "E" Street Bridge, east of the Western Pacific Railroad crossing, Marysville. The conduit will provide telephone service to Beale AFB, Linda, and Olivehurst areas.

Findings:

         It has been determined that the project will not have significant environmental effects ( no mitigation measures required ).

  X   It has been determined that although the project could have significant environmental effects there will not be a significant effect in this case because the mitigation measures described below have been added to the project.

Mitigation measures included to avoid potentially significant effects:

- 1b: During construction 10 foot cuts will be made in both levees north and south of the Yuba River paralell to Highway 70. Plans call for the existing levee soil to be replaced and compacted to 90% relative density in 6 inch layers. Damage to levee patrol road surfacing will be repaired.
- 2a: The proposed conduit itself will not affect air quality, however, during the construction phase of the conduit project proper dust control measures must be practiced to maintain the ambient air quality of the area.
- 3a: During the construction phase of the conduit project that will cross the main channel of the Yuba River the crossing will be made in two stages, half the channel at a time, using gravel cofferdams to direct flow to the alternate halves.

WHEREAS, AN APPLICATION FOR ASSESSMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT FOR A PROPOSED PRIVATE PROJECT OR ACTION for excavation and placement of telephone conduit and access manholes in the A-1-R Zone on Tax Assessor's Parcel Nos. 20-020-02 and 03, south Marysville and in the flood plain of the Yuba River, west of the Highway 70 "E" Street Bridge, east of the Western Pacific Railroad Crossing, Marysville

HAS BEEN FILED WITH THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMITTEE; AND

WHEREAS, THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMITTEE HAS MADE A FORMAL EVALUATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER SUCH PROJECT OR ACTION MAY HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT;

WHEREAS, THIS FORMAL EVALUATION WAS CONSISTENT WITH THE GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT OF 1970 PROMULGATED BY THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY FOR RESOURCES OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AS FROM TIME TO TIME AMENDED AND INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE IN ORDINANCE NO. 600; AND

WHEREAS, THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMITTEE HAS MADE A FINDING THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT OR ACTION WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND HAS PREPARED AND FILED A "NEGATIVE DECLARATION" WITH THE COUNTY CLERK IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 600; AND

WHEREAS, THE SECRETARY OF THE YUBA COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 600 HAS PUBLISHED A NOTICE IN A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE COUNTY INFORMING ALL INTERESTED PERSONS THAT SUCH NEGATIVE DECLARATION HAS BEEN PREPARED AND FILED; AND

WHEREAS, SUCH NOTICE INDICATED THE PLANNING COMMISSION WOULD CONSIDER THE MATTER AT ITS NEXT REGULAR OR ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING IF NO WRITTEN PROTEST IS FILED WITH THE SECRETARY WITHIN TEN DAYS FROM THE DATE OF PUBLICATION OF THE NOTICE; AND

WHEREAS, THE PLANNING COMMISSION HAS CONSIDERED THE MATTER AT A REGULAR MEETING/ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING ON

FOR, THEREFORE, THE PLANNING COMMISSION HEREBY FINDS, DECLARES AND ORDERS:

1. PURSUANT TO AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF LAW, NOTICE WAS DULY PUBLISHED IN THE APPEAL-DEMOCRAT, A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION PUBLISHED IN YUBA COUNTY, AT LEAST TEN (10) DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE FIXED FOR CONSIDERATION AND ACTION.
2. NO WRITTEN PROTESTS OR OBJECTIONS WERE FILED TO THE NEGATIVE DECLARATION WITHIN THE TIME PERIOD PRESCRIBED BY PUBLIC NOTICE.
3. THE COMMISSION HAS REVIEWED AND STUDIED THE RECOMMENDATION AND FINDINGS OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COMMITTEE.
4. THE COMMISSION HEREBY APPROVES THE FINDINGS SET FORTH IN THE NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND BASED UPON ALL OF THE EVIDENCE SUBMITTED FIND, THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT OR ACTION WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT AND FURTHER FINDS THAT BY REASON THEREOF THERE IS NO NECESSITY FOR THE PREPARATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT.
5. THE COMMISSION HEREBY ACCEPTS THE NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND ORDERS THE SAME FILED AS THE ASSESSMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT OR ACTION.
6. THE COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES THAT THE ADOPTION OF THIS RESOLUTION SHALL CONSTITUTE NOTICE OF THE DETERMINATION PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NO. 600 AND HEREBY ORDERS THE SAME TO BE FILED WITH THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK.
7. ALL OFFICES AND DEPARTMENTS OF THE COUNTY OF YUBA HAVING AUTHORITY IN THE MATTER MAY, IF THE PROPOSED PROJECT OR ACTION IS OTHERWISE IN CONFORMITY WITH LAW, ISSUE SUCH LEASE, PERMIT, LICENSE, CERTIFICATE, OR OTHER ENTITLEMENT FOR USE AS IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES IS DEEMED APPROPRIATE.
