DREDGING PERMIT (MODIFICATION)

APPLICANT: Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District 1125 First Street Napa, California 94558

- AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: Tide and submerged lands in the bed of the Napa River between Third Street, Napa, and Goodluck Point, Napa County.
- LAND USE: Dredge 125,000 cubic yards of minerals other than oil, gas and geothermal for maintenance of the Federal navigation channel and deposit dredged materials on publicly-owned uplands.

TERMS OF ORIGINAL PERMIT: Initial period: one year from July 1, 1980.

> Consideration: The public use and benefit; royalty \$0.25 per cubic yard in the event dredged materials are placed on private property, sold, or used for any private or commercial benefit.

TERMS OF PROPOSED MODIFICATION: Extension: two years from July 1, 1981.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit; royalty \$0.25 per cubic yard in the event dredged materials are placed on private property, sold, or used for any private or commercial benefit.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The United States Army Corps of Engineers proposed last year to dredge the navigation channel of a portion of the Napa River within Napa County and requested the County to act as "local sponsor" for the project by providing disposal sites and obtaining State permits. Because of funding limitations, the project was deferred.
- A Finding of No Significant Impact for the project was prepared by the District Engineer, San Francisco District, United States Army Corps of Engineers, pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act, on June 6, 1980, and was reviewed and considered by the Commission on July 24, 1980.
- This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class B, which authorizes Limited Use.

Staff review indicates that there will be no significant effect upon the identified environmental values.

4. Staff has prepared a permit modification document which includes all the above provisions. Said document is on file in the Offices of the State Lands Commission.

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IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

- 1. A FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ENCOMPASSING THE PROPOSED PROJECT WAS REVIEWED AND CONSIDERED BY THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION AT THE JULY 24, 1980, COMMISSION MEETING. IT WAS DETERMINED AT THAT TIME THE PROPOSED PROJECT WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRON-MENT.
- 2. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1, OF THE P.R.C.
- AUTHORIZE THE STAFF TO ISSUE TO NAPA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL 3. AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT THE DREDGING PERMIT MODIFICATION ON FILE IN THE OFFICES OF THE COMMISSION. SAID MODIFICATION, WHICH SHALL BE ISSUED IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, SHALL EXTEND THE TERMINATION OF THE PERMIT FROM JUNE 30, 1981 TO JUNE 30, 1983. NO OTHER CHANGES ARE MADE IN THE TERMS OF THE PERMIT, WHICH PROVIDES FOR DREDGING 125,000 CUBIC YARDS OF ACCUMULATED SEDIMENTS FROM AN AREA OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS IN THE FEDERAL NAVIGATION CHANNEL OF THE NAPA R'VER, WITH SPOILS DEPOSITION ON PUBLICLY-OWNED UPLANDS. SAID AREA IS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO AND BY THIS REFERENCE EXPRESSLY MADE A PART HEREOF. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT AUTHORIZED BY THE COMMISSION ON JULY 24, 1980, REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

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
