- 1. This project is exempt from CEQA because it is an existing facility and there is no evidence of record to show injury to adjacent property, shoreline erosion, or other types of environmental degradation, pursuant to P.R.C. 21084, 14 Cal. Adm. Code 15100 et seq. and 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905.
- 2. The project is situated on lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in use category "Class B" which authorizes Limited Use. The existing project will not have a significant effect upon the identified environmental values.
- The project does not quality for a recreational pier permit since upland is not used primarily for single family residence.
