A 0.699-acre parcel of tide and submerged lands, located in Turner Cut near Stockton,

LAND USE

Construction, reconstruction and maintenance of a vehicular bridge utilized for public transportation.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period:

49 years from January 1, 1983.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit, with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$189.
- Applicant proposes to construct a concrete bridge that will provide 24-hour all weather vehicular transportation between Roberts and McDonald Islands. Present transportation between the islands is limited to a cable ferry that operates 16 hours daily, except during periods of maintenance, dense fog, and windy weather. This service will be discontinued when the bridge is in place. An all weather link between these islands will facilitate and enhance the commercial, recreational and levee maintenance activities of the area. The completed project will provide a statewide public benefit.
- 3. A negative declaration was prepared and certified by Reclamation District No. 2030, pursuant to CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. Reclamation District No. 2030 found that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment. A Notice of Determination has been received by staff.
- 4. This project is situated on lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class B,

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which authorizes Limited Use. The project as proposed will not have a significant effect upon the identified environmental values.

APPROVALS OBTAINED:

United States Army Corps of Engineers, United States Coast Guard, California Department of Fish and Game, California Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board, California Reclamation Board and the County of San Joaquin.





Negative Declaration

Pursuant to: Division 13, Public Resource Code

Description:

It is proposed to construct a vehicular bridge across the body of water known as Turner Cut between McDonald Tract and Roberts Island in San Joaquin County. The bridge will have a moveable span and will replace an existing ferry. There is need for a twenty-four-hour-a-day, all weather, access to McDonald Tract for autos, trucks, and emergency vehicles.

The project is in the San Joaquin Delta, a group of reclaimed islands below sea level, bordered by dikes and channels. The area is primarily farm land.

An Initial Study has been prepared by the Reclamation Districts On the basis of this study it is determined that the proposed action will not have a significant effect upon the environment for the following reasons:

- There will be no change in land use and the project will not induce growth or development.
- 2. There will be no significant change in air or water quality or in noise level.
- There will be no effect on fish, wildlife, vegetation, or wetlands that will not be mitigated to an insignificant level.
- 4. There will be no effect in living units, businesses or the economy of the area.
- There will be no effect on property and sites of historic and cultural significance.
- 6. There will be no significant effect on prime agricultural land or the composition or character of vehicular or waterborne traffic.

3a. There will be no significant effect on the floodplains.
