CLOSING ACCOUNTS OF
TIDELAND OIL REVENUE EXPENDITURES FOR
SUBSIDENCE VERTICAL AND HORIZONTAL SURVEYS
IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH
DURING 1981-1982 FISCAL YEAR

SUBSIDENCE PROJECT:

Subsidence Vertical and Horizontal Measurements
and Studies in the City of Long Beach Harbor
District between July 1, 1981 and June 30,
1982.

FISCAL IMPACT: Total costs amounted to \$236,202.65 and
were withheld by the City from tideland
oil revenues due the State.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

Chapter 138/'64 1st E.S., Sections 1(e)
and 4(d).

COMMISSION PRIOR APPROVAL:

June 24, 1981, Minute Item 36.

CONDITIONS FULFILLED:

1. That the amounts, if any, to be allowed
ultimately as subsidence costs deductible
under Chapter 138/'64 1st E.S., Section
4(d), would be determined by the Commission
upon an engineering review and final
audit by Commission staff after the
work was completed.

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2. That the scope of work performed is essentially in conformance with the details of such work as previously defined by the Commission.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

On June 24, 1981 the Commission granted prior approval to the City of Long Beach for various subsidence maintenance, repairs and studies projects to be performed in the Long Beach Harbor District during the 1981-1982 fiscal year. In addition to the vertical and horizontal surveys, other projects included annual general maintenance work, preliminary engineering studies for remedial projects, consultant services, emergency remedial work and City staff and administrative expenses associated with these projects, all of which were directly related to past subsidence within the boundaries of the Harbor District.

On February 9, 1982 the Commission approved an agreement between the State and the City settling all past and future claims by the City for damages in the Harbor District which resulted from subsidence which had occurred prior to that date, except that the cost of the vertical and horizontal surveys were excluded. It was agreed that continuation of the surveys was necessary for on-going subsidence monitoring.

The item now before the Commission is the ratification of costs and approval to close accounts of the vertical and horizontal subsidence surveys conducted during the 1981-1982 fiscal year.

2. ON THE BASIS OF THIS DETERMINATION, AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF APPROPRIATE WRITTEN INSTRUMENTS TO FINALLY CLOSE THESE ACCOUNTS.
