DREDGING PERMIT

In accordance with the Commission Delegation of Authority to the Executive Officer on February 4, 1977 (Minute Item 32) to issue dredging permits of 10,000 cubic yards or less, to perform maintenance dredging on State owned lands, the following applicant has been granted such permission:

APPLICANT:

United States Coast Guard 12th C. G. District Government Island Alameda, CA 94501

The permit provides for excavating a maximum of 3,500 cubic yards of sediments, excluding all other minerals including but not limited to oil, gas and geothermal, from granted submerged lands in Noyo Harbor. Dredging is required to remove sediments deposited within the harbor and mooring basin to facilitate safe navigation.

Spoil will be placed on an upland disposal site inboard of a new sheetpile bulkhead to be installed. No royalty will be charged for spoils placed on State owned sovereign lands, a royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard will be charged

for spoils placed behind the new sheet pile bulkhead or on private property or sold for commercial benefit; a royalty of \$0.15 per cubic yard will be charged for spoils placed in an offshore disposal site.

In compliance with said delegation of authority it has been determined that the following conditions have been met:

- 1. The proposed project is categorically exempt from the requirements of the CEQA Guidelines as maintenance dredging with spoils disposal in an approved uplanudisposal area (P.R.C. 21084, Cal. Adm. Code 15104g).
- 2. Issuance of the permit and the resultant project will have no significant adverse effect on the environment or the environmental characteristics identified pursuant to Section G370.1 et seq. of the P.R.C.
- 3. The dredging amount will not exceed 10,000 cubic yards.
- 4. A charge per cubic yard will be assessed for spoil material not deposited on sovereign lands or otherwise lost to future State benefit.
- 5. Approval of the project will be contingent upon approval by all pertinent State, Federal and local agencies.
