DREDGING PERMIT

APPLICANT:

Sonoma County Regional Parks 2403 Professional Drive, Suite 100 Santa Rosa, California 95401

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Granted lands with minerals reserved on the bed of Bodega Bay, Sonoma County, specifically in Spud Point Marina and the Federal Channel.

LAND USE:

Dredge up to 225,000 cubic yards of sediments to deepen the harbor basin and Federal Channel to eacilitate berth access and navigability.

Spoils to be deposited at the authorized site at the Old Airport.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period: Two years from December 1, 1983.

CONSIDERATION:

No royalty to be charged for spoils placed on publicly owned lands. A royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard will be charged for spoils placed on private property or sold for commercial benefit.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Sonoma County Regional Parks District has applied for a permit to dredge up to 225,000 cubic yards of material from the Spud Point Marina berthing basin and the associated Federal Channel from Spud Point Marina, Bodega Bay, Sonoma County. Spoils will be removed from the Harbor and placed at the upland site at "The Old Airport", The disposal site is located on county land.
- 2. An EIS for this project was prepared by the United States Army Corps of Engineers and a subsequent EIR (SCH#80032503) and amendment to the EIR (SCH#80032503) were prepared, circulated for review via State Clearinghouse, and certified by the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors on July 1, 1980. A Notice of Determination has been received.
- due to operational restrictions imposed by the Uniced States Fish and Wildlife Service for protection of juvenile crabs. This restriction would allow deciging only during the period from October through February. Mitigation measures providing for salt marsh restoration and eel grass growth studies have been adopted by the Sonoma County Regional Parks District.
- 4. This project is situated on State lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1 and is classified in Use Category Class C Multiple Use. Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations which nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. Such agencies have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.

- 4. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON THE ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1 OF THE P.R.C.
- 5. AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE TO SONOMA COUNTY REGIONAL PARKS DISTRICT OF A TWO-YEAR DREDGING PERMIT FROM DECEMBER 1, 1983, WITH NO ROYALTY CHARGED FOR SPOILS PLACED ON PUBLICLY OWNED LANDS AND A ROYALTY OF SO.23 PER CUBIC YARD FOR SPOILS PLACED ON PRIVATE PROPERTY OF SOLD FOR COMMERCIAL BENEFIT.
