CLOSING ACCOUNTS OF TIDELAND OIL REVENUE EXPENDITURES FOR SUBSIDENCE VERTICAL AND HORIZONTAL SURVEYS IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH DURING 1982-1983 FISCAL YEAR

SUBSIDENCE PROJECT:

Subsidence Vertical and Horizontal Measurements and Studies in the City of Long Beach Harbor District between July 1, 1982 and June 30, 1983.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

On June 29, 1982 the Commission granted prior approval to the City of Long Beach for \$235,000 in subsidence cost expenditures to be used in the conduct of vertical and horizontal measurements and studies in the Long Beach Harbor District during the 1982-1983 fiscal year. The work consists of analysis and interpretation of data developed from twice yearly elevation and lineal surveys carried out through an established network of ground control points dispersed throughout the project area. The purpose is to detect the occurrence, if any, of subsidence of the land surface. The vertical (elevation) surveys are conducted each May and November and the horizontal (linear) surveys each February and August. No significant change in the Harbor District land surface was detected during 1982-83.
