AUTHORIZATION FOR EXECUTION OF SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

At its May 1980 meeting, the Commission approved a Memorandum of Understanding with the Bureau of Land Management, setting forth general guidelines and procedures for processing mutually beneficial land exchanges. At the May 1984 meeting, the Executive Officer's Report included an update on negotiations with BLM regarding the exchange of the State's unsurveyed base lands.

BLM has proposed a supplement to the 1980 Memorandum of Understanding citing specific actions to be taken to process the exchange by which the State would exchange its interest in 53,000 acres of unsurveyed lands mostly in Inyo County for an equal value of BLM timberlands in Mendocino County. Staff, after review, concludes the supplement will facilitate processing the transaction.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State Guidelines.
