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RETROCESSION OF JURISDICTION AT MATHER AIR FORCE BASE, SACRAMENTO COUNTY

The United States has partial legislative jurisdiction at Mather Air Force Base. It has requested that the State accept a retrocession of such jurisdiction over a portion of the Base Government Code Section 113 authorizes the Commission to accept the retrocession after a public hearing has been held to det runne if the retrocession is in the State's best interests. The covernment Code also requires the United States to pay costs associated with the hearing.

This Calendar Item requests Commission authority to conduct the public hearing and to enter a contract for payment of costs.

 Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Gode 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA,

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
