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BANK PROTECTION AND EROSION CONTROL MEASURES. DISCOVERY PARK. JUNCIVIRE OF SACRAMENTO RIVER AND AMERICAN RIVER

THE COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO HAS SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION FOR AN EROSION AND BANK PROTECTION PERMIT AT DISCOVERY PARK TO PREVENT THE LOSS OF PARK LAND. THE COUNTY HAS ALSO REQUESTED ADVANCE PERMISSION FOR THE WORK TO QUALIFY FOR A STATE GRANT; THE GRANT IS SUBJECT TO APPROVALS FROM REGULATORY AGENCIES BY DECEMBER 31, 1984.

I HAVE ISSUED A LETTER OF ADVANCE PERMISSION TO THE COUNTY FOR THIS PROJECT, AND THE COUNTY'S APPLICATION IS BEING PROCESSED BY THE STAFF.
