AMENDMENT TO EXISTING DREDGING PERMIT FROM 275,000 CUBIC YARDS TO 470,000 CUBIC YARDS

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ÄREA, TYPE HAND AND HOCATION:

Tide and submerged land granted to the City of San Francisco with minerals reserved to the State, San Francisco With minerals reserved to the

LAND USE:

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Dredge up to 470,000 cubic yards of material from the main basin and piers at the Todd Shipyards to enhance accessibility and capacity at the Shipyard.

RESUME OF PREVIOUS ACTION:

The Commission on November 29, 1984 authorized issuance of Dredging Permit PRC 6759, to the applicant, Todd' Shipyards, for one year effective January 1, 1985 for dredging of up to 275,000 cubic yards of sediments from the basin and piers at the Todd Shipyard to enhance accessibility and capacity at the Shipyard. Spoils disposal is at the United States Corps of Engineers approved Disposal Site S.F. 11 near Alactraz with a \$0.15 per cubic yard royalty to be charged for spoils placed at the United States Corps of Engineers Disposal Site S.F. 11.

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CALENDAR TTEM NO. 24 (CONTID)

PROPOSED MODIFICATION:

Increase the permitted dredging volume of 275,000 cubic yards an additional 195,000 cubic yards to allow for an underestimated initial amount brought on by excessive siltation from last winter's floods. All other terms and conditions of the existing permit PRC 6759 are to remain unchanged.

CONSIDERATION:

: To facilitate continued dredging of the designated area by allowing for the 195,000 cubic yard increase which will permit the removal of excessive siltation brought in by heavy winter storms.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION: Pursuant to 2 Cal. Adm. Sode 2003.

AB 884; N/A.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- This project was approved by the lead agency, the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission, in an administrative permit (No. M84-82) wherein the project was determined to have no significant effect on the environment. The Bay Commission's findings are contained in that permit. The State Lands Commission's staff concurs with the B.C.D.C. determination that the project will not have a significant effect upon the environment.
- 2. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values punsuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
- 3. All necessary application requirements have been fulfilled. The royalty received, pursuant to this amendment as well as the origninal permit, will go into a suspense account pending Commission review of its dredging policy.
