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ASSIGNMENT OF A GEOTHERMAL LEASE

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Approximately 120 acres of reserved mineral land in the eastern portion of The Geysens Geothermal Steamfield; Lake Gounty.

PREREQUISITES:

- 1. Assignment forms have been executed.
- 2. Assignee is qualified to hold a State lease.
- The statutony filing fees have been submitted.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

State Geothermal Lease PRC 520% was issued by competitive bidding in 1976. The City of Santa Clara was the highest qualified bidder with a bid of 28 percent of net profits. Pursuant to PRC Section 6912(b) the owner of the surface matched the high bid, was awarded the lease and subsequently assigned the lease to Natomas Energy. Company with which it had a surface lease.

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Natomas drilled a geothermal well on the state lease in 1979 which was marginally commercial. A second well drilled from the same pad north into private lands yielded disappointing results. Since then Natomas has been seeking a market and at one time proposed to drill some more wells and construct and operate a small powerplant on the state lease.

In 1984 Phillips Petroleum Company purchased Aminoil USA, Inc and through that acquisition obtained Aminoil's leases to the northwest of the state parcel which supplies steam to Pacific Gas and Electric Company's Powerplant 16. Because of Phillips' land position, Natomas feels Phillips would be the logical firm to develop the resource from the state lease and has therefore requested that PRC 5206 be assigned to Phillips.

In a plan of development submitted by Phillips in conjunction with the request for assignment three possible plans for development of the state lease are proposed: (1) drill more wells on the state lease, build a pipeline and deliver the steam to Powerplant 16. While this is the most attractive plan from the state's standpoint because it would result in royalty revenue to the state in a very short time, because a steep terrain, constructing such a pipeline may hot be feasible from an engineering standpoint; (2) construction and operating a PURPA powerplant on the pad used to drill Davies State well No. 1 and slant drill additional wells from the pad; and (3) develop the lease and send the steam to powerplants operated by the Northern California Power Agency to the south of the state parcel.

Section 36 of the lease and P.R.C. Section 6925 provide that the lessee may assign all or part of the lease subject to the prior written consent of the Commission.

An EIR covering the area was certified by the State Lands Commission prior to issuing the lease.
