OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- The State Department of Transportation has made application for the required right-of-way over State sovereign lands to construct a new bridge across the Sacramento River on State Highway 32. The existing bridge is over 75 years old, is substandard and has numerous operational problems. The old bridge will be replaced with the new one, and a "Certificate of Release" will be prepared and executed for the area, no longer being used.
- 2. The annual rental walue of the site is estimated to be \$2,129.
- A Negative Declaration was prepared and adopted for this project by California Department of Transportation. The State Lands Commission s staff has reviewed such document and believes that it complies with the requirements of the CEQA.





NEGATIVE DECLERATION (CEQA)

Pursuant to: Division 13, Public Reschrees Code

Description of Proposal

This project proposes the replacement of the Ginnelli Bridge and improvement of the sharp curves approaching each end of the bridge. The 580-foot-long bridge is narrow with impaired vertical clearances. The proposal would replace the existing 19-foot-wide bridge with a new 40-foot-wide bridge; thereby improving thatfic safety and providing a more uniform that it flows:

The Gianelli Bridge is located on State Route 32 and crosses the Sacramento River at the Glenn-Butte County Line about 10 miles west of Chico. The surrounding area is flat, valley terrain, and the land use is primarily agricultural. Highway 32 is an east-west link from the Sierras to the west side of the Sacramento Valley. It serves as a connecting link between Interstate 5 near Orland and State Noute 99 near Chico.

Determination

An Environmental Assessment (Initial Study) has been prepared by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) of One the basis of this study, it is determined that the proposed action will not have a significant effect upon the anvironment for the following reasons:

- 1. Increases in turbadity in the Sacramento River during construction will be minor and of short durations. Therefore, the project will have most significant impact on water quality.
- 2. No social, recreational and educational, facilities will be affected. No archaeological sites will be affected.
- 3. No changes are anticipated in the composition or volume of the traffic as a result of implementation of the proposed project.
- 4. The project will not create a growth-inducing impact or alter the land use in the area:
- 5. The "B, Modified" alternate would require approximately 11 agres of agricultural land for right of way purposes. The taking of the agricultural land is not considered significant in comparison with the total remaining farm acreage in this area.

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- 6. A historical structure (Gianelli Bridge), which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, will be removed. The impact on this 4(f) property will be mitigated by documentation of the Gianelli Bridge in conformance with the requirements of the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER).
- 7. A historical building (the Gianella Dairy Barn) eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places is located just outside the project limits. The Gianella Dairy Barn will not be adversely affected by the
- 8. No rare or endangered plant species will be affected by the proposed project. No vegetation will be significantly affected by the proposal.
- 9. No fish or wildlife will be significantly affected by the proposal. No proposed project.
- 10. The proposal will not have a significant affect on aesthetics or neighborhoods. The economy of the area will not be significantly affected.
- 31. The proposal will have no significant affect on air quality or noise levels.
- 12. No. floodplains will be significantly affected. The proposal will not affect any wetlands.
