RECREATIONAL PIER PERMITS

TERMS: Initial period: Ten years.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of  
authority and the State CEQA Guidelines  
(14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has  
determined that these activities are exempt  
from the requirements of the CEQA as  
categorical exempt projects. These

projects are exempt under Class 1 (existing facilities, Items No. A and B), and Class 3 (new construction, Items No. B and C),  
2 Cal. Adm. Code 2905.

Authority: P.R.C. 21084, 14 Cal. Adm. Code 2905.

2. These activities involve lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the projects as proposed are consistent with the lands' use classification.
3. Lake Tahoe Application: The Commission at its meeting on November 27, 1978, suspended all leasing for new construction at Lake Tahoe, except for mooring buoys in designated areas. This action was taken pending completion of an EIR which addresses the cumulative impact of continued construction of piers in Lake Tahoe. The application herein is for the continued use of an existing pier in the lake, and therefore is not subject to the Commission's suspension of leasing activities for new construction.
4. All permits covering structures in Lake Tahoe will include a condition subsequent that if any structure authorized is found to be in nonconformance with the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's Shorezone ordinance and if any alterations, repairs, or removal required pursuant to said ordinance are not accomplished within the designated time period, then the permit will be automatically terminated, effective upon notice by the State and the site shall be cleared pursuant to the terms thereof.

CALENDAR ITEM NO. C 0 5 (CONT'D)

5. Item B (John Douglass) is an existing boat dock and the proposed addition of two 4' x 30' docks to the existing one. The total occupied area is approximately 330 square feet.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT THESE ACTIVITIES ARE EXEMPT FORM CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15061 AS CATEGORICAL EXEMPT PROJECTS, CLASS 1 (EXISTING FACILITIES, ITEMS NO. A AND B) AND CLASS 3 (NEW CONSTRUCTION, ITEMS NO. B & C), 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2905, AND FIND THAT THESE ACTIVITIES ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 6370 ET SEQ.
2. AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF TEN YEAR RECREATIONAL PIER PERMITS TO THE APPLICANTS LISTED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.
